# LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT

## **Juan Ignacio Carbonel Pintanel**

Do not be afraid of yourself. With our SERADE campaign, which celebrates its 25th anniversary, we address an issue that we consider to be of great relevance for today's youth. This is also reflected in the European Youth Strategy 2021-27, which proposes young people's well-being and mental health as one of its goals.

The strategy, published two years before the start of the pandemic, already warned that "a significant and growing number of young people across Europe express concern about the prevalence among their peers of mental health problems, such as high levels of stress, anxiety, depression and other mental illnesses. Young people mention the immense social pressures they face today."

"If you want to build a ship, don't drum up the men to gather wood, divide the work and give orders. Instead, teach them to yearn for the vast and endless sea." Saint-Exupéry's famous advice in "The Little Prince" inspires this campaign with which we seek to recall the strength of our youth to improve society. It is not only a question of capabilities - the most prepared generation in history, we often hear - but of what is the purpose - the yearnings - for which it is worthwhile to act.

In the Third Sector we also feel responsible for this task. Thus, we attend debates and forums aimed at involving young people more in the wide range of social needs. From International Cooperation we work to promote channels of social participation through volunteering; to encourage their capacity for innovation and social entrepreneurship; to propose educational tools to consolidate this purpose and to give them a leading role in the creation and consolidation of new social projects and cooperation for development. These pages intend to reflect the variety of activities carried out by young people in the service of this mission.

Thanks to all the social, educational and youth organizations that support this work, and to the companies and institutions that support our social actions, we celebrate our 30th anniversary next year with the hope of consolidating our work at a European level through *International Youth Cooperation*.

# OUR OBJECTIVE

International Cooperation is a Spanish non-profit organization, 2017 State Award for Social Volunteering, Golden Cross of the Civil Order of Social Solidarity and declared a Public Utility Entity, which has been working since 1993 "for a supportive youth". The NGO is also present through the International Youth Cooperation brand in its work outside of Spain.

From a Christian conception of man, in International Cooperation we promote a culture of solidarity among young people and offer them the opportunity to engage in volunteer, education and awareness projects as tools for social transformation. We promote human development in accordance with the dignity of people. To do this, we create channels for social participation through four lines of action:



## EDUCATIONAL SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY

We seek ways to involve the school, the family, and society as a whole, to raise awareness of their enormous potential for promoting a culture of social justice.

### **VOLUNTEERING**

We create channels for the social participation of young people through volunteering and other solidarity actions in favor of those most in need.





## Educational Social Responsibility

We work for a comprehensive academic training since early stages of education, for young people not to remain indifferent to their environment's needs. In this task we include school, family, and society. In order to do so, we facilitate tools to help educational institutions transmitting a culture focused on the common good, in line with United Nations' Sustainable Development Goals.

## OBSERVATORY OF EDUCATIONAL SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY

International Cooperation launched this research, observation and analysis platform in 2011, the purpose of which is to transmit to educational centers their responsibility in achieving the SDGs. This platform has an **Academic Committee** made up of experts and professors from universities in **Europe** and **Latin America**.

# **SOLIDARITY STORIES**

The Story Contest "A Chance to build a better world" promotes values among schoolchildren from 5th grade of primary school to 4th grade of ESO (secondary school), thanks to the collaboration of the Institut Valencià de la Joventut.



## SOLIDARITY SCHOOL

Supportive School is a project for involving educational community in achieving Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). We help educational centers to develop their **Socio-Educational Responsibility** syllabus. This project counts on the support of the Valladolid Provincial Council, the Youth Institute of the Council of Castilla y León and the Council of Galicia.

#### WHAT WE OFFER:

- Advice for the design of an Educational Social Responsibility Plan (RSED Plan).
- Educational resources to improve knowledge of social needs, oriented to the Sustainable Development Goals.
- Training for teachers by providing tools that allow them to work with the educational materials that we provide to work on different social realities.
- Exhibitions, educational guides, audiovisuals, publications, web pages, resources for volunteering, forums and tools for social entrepreneurship, etc.
- We help in the implementation of the actions of the RSED Plan.
- Recognition as a Socially Responsible Center.
- Socio-educational support projects for minors in vulnerable situations.

## LEISURE AND FREE TIME

We have developed training actions for more than **60 youth** associations throughout Spain. In the months leading up to summer, the training was pointed to provide procedures and action guides for the organization of leisure and free time activities. As part of this program, we promoted urban camps with minors in risk of social exclusion such as Villa de Vallecas or Tetuán (Madrid), Zaragoza (Aragón), San Andrés (Tenerife) and Pontevedra (Galicia).

# EDUCATIONAL MATERIALS

We edit and disseminate different educational materials such as training videos on social issues or traveling exhibitions, with awareness sessions, which are offered to all educational centers that request them.

### Poverty and Dignity

We are all equal in dignity. We approach poverty as a phenomenon that undermines the dignity of the person and, therefore, commits us all to find ways to have access to resources in a free and responsible way. This project includes a traveling exhibition with a **Didactic Guide** for the educator, with activities to understand the magnitude of poverty and how to eradicate it.



#### > I Youth

It is a project to raise awareness against discrimination and xenophobia for an inclusive citizenship. It has involved **9,130 young people** (14-19 years old) in **Madrid**, **Pontevedra**, **Seville**, **Zaragoza** and **Tenerife**. It focuses on promoting coexistence between different cultures and preventing racist behavior in favor of Human Rights. Awareness-raising classrooms, idea laboratories (**346 young people**) and intercultural workshops (**382 young people**) have been carried out. And the creation of the **I Youth platform**. In addition, the **awareness campaign** "Uncomfortable Questions" reached **63,199 people**, who have received this awareness-raising message about immigration and how to combat prejudices.

International Cooperation and Boeing celebrate 15 years of firm commitment to supporting children in vulnerable situations in Madrid, through the socio-educational support program "Volando Juntos" (Flying Together). This project fosters **STEM** skills and competencies in boys and girls, so that they become familiar with scientific concepts from an early age and helps to eliminate the educational gap in these areas of knowledge. Since its inception, 1,069 children have participated in the "Flying Together" program. During the current school year, 25 vulnerable primary schoolchildren receive daily socio-educational support after school hours in Madrid. from Monday to Friday.

# A FUTURE FOR CHILDREN

With this project we offer tutoring, for the improvement of their academic performance, to children in vulnerability situation. Besides, we facilitate them tools to reinforce their personal and psycho-affective skills with different workshops and cultural, sport, technological, artistic, leisure and free time activities and volunteering. All of this is possible thanks to dozens of volunteers who spend their time helping children with homework and activities.

Our support programs are carried out in different cities in Madrid, Comunidad Valenciana, Andalucía, Castilla y León and Galicia. For this initiative we have help from public administrations and private entities such as Sage Foundation, EDM and La Caixa Foundation.

## NEW TECHNOLOGIES CODE

In relation to the development of digital competence, this project aims to foster a reflective attitude among young people to learn about the many opportunities and challenges of information and communication technologies reflective attitude among young people to learn about the multiple opportunities and challenges of information and communication technologies. In 2022, in the territorial area of **Castilla y León**, around **250 boys and girls** were trained in the proper use and exploitation of information and communication technologies.





## EVERYONE TO BREAKFAST

Kellogg has been promoting this program since 2011 to contribute to improving the conditions of children in vulnerable situations by offering them a daily, balanced breakfast. International Cooperation coordinates its development in Spain in collaboration with the participating schools and volunteers. During the 2021-2022 school year, 127,575 breakfasts were served to 874 students in 10 schools in Madrid, Valencia, Valladolid, Málaga, Córdoba and Seville.



## W. K. KELLOGG SCHOLARSHIP FOR STUDIES

The Kellogg's Scholarships is an initiative of the Kellogg Company, which is developed in Spain in collaboration with International Cooperation. These grants are aimed at beneficiaries of the "Todos a Desayunar" ("Everyone to breakfast") program, which enables students in secondary school or post-compulsory studies with socioeconomic difficulties to continue their education. Thanks to this support, we accompany these young people in their personal and educational development, promoting their future labor insertion. In 2022, three scholarships were awarded to secondary school students. There are currently ten students on scholarships in this program.



## SOCIAL LEADERSHIP PROGRAM

We work with children and young people of immigrant origin who are in the process of social inclusion in the neighborhood of San Pablo (Zaragoza), an area with a high rate of marginalization. More than **50 volunteers -high school and university students-** participate in this project in collaboration with the **C.E.I.P Santo Domingo**, the only public school in the neighborhood. Using the 3 C's (head -cabeza-, body - cuerpo-, and heart -corazón-), they work with **100 boys and girls** through study, sports and volunteering.

- **Mondays and Wednesdays:** Accompaniment and collaboration with the dinners of the elderly residents of the Cruz Blanca.
- **Tuesdays:** Volunteering with people with disabilities from the Los Pueyos Foundation.
- **Thursdays:** Training from the Inclusive Sports School with people with disabilities
- **Fridays:** Accompaniment with the elderly of the Virgen del Pilar Social Center.

### Last year, this program benefited 280 people.

This project is supported by Bergner, the Nemesio Díez Foundation, the Department of Citizenship and Social Rights of the Government of Aragon, Evair, La Caixa Foundation, Ibercaja and Patricia Ramírez (psychologist). During the summer months, PLS Summer is in charge of giving continuity to this reinforcement.

#### **SOCIO-EDUCATIONAL PROGRAM**

In 2022, for the fourth consecutive year, we continue with the **socio-educational program** in the neighborhood of **San Andrés (Tenerife)**. Educational support and English classes are offered to **50 children** at risk of social exclusion, in collaboration with the **Oryles Foundation**, **DISA** and **La Caixa Foundation**.



## **Volunteering**

Throughout the year, our volunteers participated in a wide variety of projects and initiatives, in Spain and abroad, for the benefit of the most disadvantaged sectors. In addition to the group to which each action is directed, young people are the main beneficiaries of our solidarity activities. And it is that the volunteering they do, under the motto "Living for others", leaves an indelible mark on them, which helps them to always have the perspective of service to others in everything they undertake.



## **AID TO LA PALMA**

To help those affected by the eruption of the volcano on La Palma, Google donated \$46,000 thanks to the initiative promoted by Telma, one of its employees. The money was used to buy furniture for the most vulnerable families.

## **DIRECT AID PROGRAM TO MEET NEEDS:**



This project aims to help cover the food needs of families at risk of social exclusion in Madrid, Seville (where it has the collaboration of La Caixa Foundation), Burgos and Valladolid. This year, in Madrid, 192 volunteers helped 64 families each month, thanks to the collaboration of the Food Bank. In Seville, every week, food, clothing and school supplies are distributed to 250 underprivileged families. In total, the 98 volunteers involved in this program have reached 810 direct beneficiaries and some 1.700 indirect beneficiaries, in coordination with the Municipal Social Services of Torreblanca, Cerro-Su Eminencia, Sevilla Este Alcosa-San Pablo and Nervión.

## VOLUNTEERING **CAMPAIGN**



"Commitment doesn't tie you down. It makes you fly" is the claim of this campaign that shows how making a commitment to improve other people's lives is worthwhile. With funding from the Ministry of Social Rights and Agenda 2030, the spot has been broadcast on RTVE, RTV Canarias and RTV Principado de Asturias, along with an excellent reception on social media during 2022.

### **SPAINSIGHT**

This project consists of teaching Spanish classes and offering individualized accompaniment to Afghan immigrants through an online platform, designed free of charge by Global Incubator. Most of them are lawyers, journalists, members of the national army, prosecutors and women's rights activists who worked in Afghanistan until the Taliban took power in August 2021. The project's volunteer teachers are young people from colleges (Ateneo and Moncloa) and companies (RIA and Telefónica), who trained 65 Afghans (48 women and 17 men).



## **VISTALEGRE SOCIAL KITCHEN**

During 2022, thanks to the involvement of more than 60 volunteers, 20,980 menus have been delivered to the Solidarity Canteen of Torrejón de Ardoz. Currently, 440 weekly menus are being prepared. The Kitchen has the support of Palacio Vistalegre, IT Fuenllana and La Fábrica Group. This year BBVA Asset Management, Logista Parcel, ALD, Mutua Madrileña Foundation, Sabadell, Bankinter, Lazard, Pryconsa Foundation, Velilla and Académica have participated as collaborators.

# A SMILE FOR CHRISTMAS

Once again this year, the goal was exceeded: **9,582 children** at risk of social exclusion were able to enjoy their gifts this Christmas. In 2022, **7,731 employees** from **74 companies** in **26 Spanish cities** participated, with the special collaboration of **Bankinter** and **BNP Paribas**, the outstanding participation of **Telefónica Foundation** and **Allianz**, and the logistical support of **ALD Automotive**.







Around **2,000 young volunteers** were involved in some of the campaign's **350 solidarity initiatives**, including the distribution of food to **2,222 direct beneficiaries**, in collaboration with **90 social entities**.

During 2022, International Cooperation was present in Madrid at various volunteer fairs, bringing solidarity activities closer to young people:

## FRIDAY REVOLUTION



Friday Revolution offers young people a different and attractive weekend plan. Hundreds of young people learn about the value of volunteering through specific actions in order to discover the transforming value of stable social commitment. Every Friday and Saturday, dozens of volunteers deliver snacks and breakfasts to the homeless, rehabilitate houses through Painting For Others, visit the elderly, as well as organize sports and leisure activities with children and people with disabilities. During 2022, 276 young people participated in these solidarity activities for the benefit of vulnerable groups in Madrid, Seville, Málaga, Córdoba and Granada.

## NEIGHBORHOOD PARTICIPATION PROJECT

In **Tenerife**, in the Añaza neighborhood, this project continues thanks to the support of **VISO-CAN**. The aim is to improve the neighborhood coexistence of **350 families** living in this vulnerable area through solidarity actions such as painting houses and common areas, workshops with children or community cleaning tasks.

## BUSINESS SOLIDARITY DAY

In its 15th edition, this day of corporate volunteering organized by **International Cooperation** with the collaboration of **RB Iberia**, brought together **24 social entities** and **27 companies** that participated in **30 initiatives** across **8 cities**. These actions were aimed at improving the social and environmental conditions of the immediate environment. In 2022, around **500 volunteers** participated in **Madrid**, **A Coruña**, **Barcelona**, **Badajoz**, **Seville**, **Valencia**, **Vigo** and **Zaragoza**.



## **BREAKFAST FOR OTHERS**

School performance can be affected when children do not receive a good diet. This program provides a complete and balanced breakfast, as well as accompaniment in the mornings, before the start of classes, to children in vulnerable situations. In **Valencia**, **45 volunteers** distribute breakfasts every morning to **460 children**. In 2022, **Granada** will also join the project, at **CEIP Arrayanes**, with more than **40 children** served, thanks to the participation of **9 volunteers**.









## COMMUNITY KITCHENS

In Madrid, more than **150 volunteers** from different youth groups cooked for homeless people and families in vulnerable situations in the soup kitchens of **San José** (San Ramón No nato parish), **Canillejas** (Virgen Blanca parish) and **Obra Social Álvaro del Portillo**, in Carabanchel.

In **Cantabria**, we have developed a stable activity of accompaniment with the residents of sheltered apartments under the auspices of the **Economic Kitchen**.

Solidarity breakfasts and snacks are organized in all Territorial Areas to provide accompaniment to the homeless. Throughout 2022, more than 300 volunteers distributed breakfasts and provided support and accompaniment to homeless people in A Coruña, Asturias, Cantabria, Córdoba, Granada, Madrid, Málaga, Santiago de Compostela, Seville, Valladolid and Vigo. In Madrid alone, the average number of people assisted each weekend was 160 beneficiaries. The initiative was supported by Kellogg.





We assist companies in the development of social action plans and volunteering that involve employees in projects in favor of the SDGs. This line of work allows us to respond to specific social needs through partnerships with other entities, companies and their employees. Throughout 2022, more than 450 volunteers from BBVA, Bergner, Mutua Madrileña Foundation, Telefónica Foundation, Pérez Llorca and RSM, among others, were involved. Thanks to their collaboration, we carried out initiatives to help Ukrainian refugee families, improve the quality of life of people in situations of exclusion by improving their homes, offer healthy leisure to minors at risk of social exclusion, care for the environment, accompany the elderly in nursing homes, participate in community kitchens or care for the homeless, etc.

We also look for ways to take advantage of the talent and solidarity of the human capital of those companies that financially support International Cooperation projects.

For example, **Boeing** involves members of its team to give **STEM workshops** to children through "Flying Together". They also organize visits to museums, theme parks and other fun activities. **ALD**, one of our main logistical partners, participates in the **Solidarity Breakfasts** and **Painting for Others**. For its part, **BBVA Asset Management**, a partner of the **Vistalegre Social Kitchen**, involved its employees in cooking shifts last July.

## ENVIRONMENTAL VOLUNTEERING

The aim is to raise awareness of the importance of protecting the environment and biodiversity. Environmental camps were held with 40 volunteers and 140 young beneficiaries. Another 120 volunteers were involved in planting trees, collecting garbage and cleaning up forests in Valencia and cleaning up the San Juan de Nieva beach in Asturias. In Tordesillas, four actions were carried out with 30 volunteers.





## SOLIDARITY EVENTS

- Once again this year, Valladolid welcomed 90 players to its Entrepinos Solidarity Golf Tournament to benefit the NGO's social projects.
- In Madrid, the X Intercompany Charity 7-a-side Soccer Tournament was held, in which 120 players from 8 companies participated.



## VOLUNTEERING IN HOSPITALS

Through the Hospilandia program at the Clinical Hospital of Santiago and the ASANOG Association (Galicia) as well as at the La Paz Hospital (Madrid), volunteers accompany hospitalized children. To encourage reading among elderly patients at the University Clinical Hospital of Valladolid, volunteers lend books and access to the Virtual Library of Castilla y León.



In **Seville**, in addition to humanitarian aid with more than **150 volunteers**, motivated by the war in Ukraine, **nine volunteers** traveled to **Poland** to collaborate with refugee families. Their help focused on rehabilitating and painting several rooms of the Hospice of the Felician Sisters (**Warsaw**), where 12 Ukrainian families were living; and also in **Bialystok**, attending to Ukrainian minors in collaboration with the Dialog Foundation and through rehabilitation work at a center for Ukrainian and Syrian refugees.

In **Galicia**, another group of young people traveled to **Tangier** in July to help at the La Creche Orphanage and the White Cross, in addition to giving Spanish classes to local workers. Also in **Aragon**, several groups traveled to Tangier to collaborate with Enfants Du Paradise.

# TRAINING IN INTEGRAL EDUCATION



We collaborated with the **European Foundation Society and Education** in the "Beyond Covid" project, which seeks to train volunteers, teachers, tutors and counselors from public schools in disadvantaged contexts in Madrid. In 2022, the "Training course for volunteers for the organization of urban camps in disadvantaged environments for primary and secondary school students" was held. The aim is to train these camp volunteers to achieve a change of attitude in secondary school students, providing them with an authentic integral education.

## CONFERENCES AND MEETINGS

Every year, International Cooperation takes part in the organization of innovation and training days and meetings.



In 2022, thanks to the **Culture and Assistance Foundation**, we made it possible for young people with financial difficulties to participate in the **University Days of the Pyrenees**, organized since 1983. Every summer, this event brings

together more than 200 students from 25 Spanish and international universities.

Seminars, conferences and colloquiums explore topics such as "The functioning of the healthy mind", "The productive: finding a purpose" or "The house, the city and the world: the spaces of human relationships". In addition, we also collaborate with this Foundation in the **30th Humanistic Conferences**, which include working groups divided into areas of interest related to Philosophy, Music, Cinema, Communication, History, Literature, Art and Theater.

In **Seville**, at the Guadaira College, on the occasion of the **UNIV 2022 Forum**, with the theme "Rebuilding together: the strength of human relationships", various cultural and academic activities were organized, which were attended by 70 university students.





## SERADE PROGRAM: Don't be afraid of yourself (No te tengas miedo)

This Program promotes equality and human rights since 1998, and is supported by the Ministry of Social Rights and Agenda 2030. Every year we carry out a campaign whose objective is to reflect on actions that lead to change in the world, intercultural coexistence, solidarity and social commitment.

#NoTeTengasMiedo is the campaign on mental health and wellbeing aimed at young people. The message it aims to convey to young people is the importance of looking into oneself and the illusions they have, so that they feel capable of overcoming any obstacle. The campaign has been disseminated in the Metro Madrid network and in social media.





## WOMEN AND SOCIAL INNOVATION

Women are climbing positions day by day in their right to equal opportunities and their empowerment, so that they can contribute the best of their feminine talent to society, today it becomes a necessity to achieve true progress. In International Cooperation we work to improve their training, broaden the horizon of their personal and professional concerns and favor their social participation, promoting equality between men and women, to achieve a more inclusive society.

### **SECOND CHANCE**

This project offers a second chance to sexually exploited women and girls in Mumbai. Through sewing courses and training in values, the aim is to rescue the girls from slavery, provide them with job training so that they can get a job and train them in basic skills to improve their autonomy and independence. This project is supported by Bergner Europe, Bergner India and with the collaboration of the local organization Grace Harvest Ministry.



## INTERNATIONAL YOUTH COOPERATION

This network, created in 2015, promotes a culture of responsibility and solidarity among young Europeans, through social action programs in favor of children and youth, training programs and volunteer exchanges in **12 countries**.

In 2022, the ERASMUS+ project "Our Europe, Our Future", funded by the European Union, was carried out with the participation of **6 countries**: Latvia, Czech Republic, Finland, Sweden, Italy and Spain. The objective is to strengthen several European entities through a dialogue with young Europeans working on social entrepreneurship, skills development and employability improvement projects for 12 months. To this end, meetings were organized in **Spain**, Italy and **Sweden**.







## SPANISH CLASSES FOR MIGRANT WOMEN

Since 2020, Spanish classes have been given to Moroccan women in the neighborhoods of Palmete (Seville) and San Juan de Dios (Jerez), thanks to the collaboration of the SAGE Foundation. This training is given by 6 volunteers to 26 women, on Tuesday and Thursday mornings (Seville) and Friday afternoons (Jerez).







## **Volunteer training**

International Cooperation provides the necessary training for volunteers to perform their work well, but also to acquire skills and knowledge that will make them agents of change and social innovators.

The program is as follows:

## INDIA

## **Youth Leadership Program**

Educational program that promotes the strengthening of the character of children and adolescents in the process of social inclusion who live in environments of extreme poverty in the slum of **Baiganwadi** (Mumbai). In addition, the participation of young people in social projects at the local and international level is favored. In 2022, 85 people benefited from these training activities.

### **Second chance**

Project developed in network with Grace Harvest Ministry, which works on the rehabilitation and comprehensive development of women and girls in Kamathipura, in the "red light" area. Since 2021, this project trained 90 women (14-45 years old) in the art of sewing and with basic literacy classes and personalized tutoring, to fight against sexual exploitation. The donation received of 6 sewing machines further boosted this professional path for these women, as an alternative to the semi-slavery regime in which they live.

#### Water for all

The Baiganwadi slum is home to some 200,000 people, 78% of whom live in extreme poverty, without even access to clean water. This program installs drinking water connections and filters for these families, in collaboration with Bergner and Lok Seva Sangaam, a local association. Since 2012, we have been working together with this entity on educational programs in the slum.



## **GAMBIA**

### **Education**

The objective is to improve the conditions of two schools in **Banjul**. At the **Saint Anthony nursery school**, new play areas, computer equipment in classrooms and offices will be installed, and a kitchen equipped with sanitary water, refrigerators, electricity and gas will be built. In addition, maintenance and repairs will be carried out on the facilities. At the **Santa Teresa school**, electrical work, painting, carpentry, installation of blackboards in six classrooms and a computer lab with recycled equipment will be carried out.

## **IVORY COAST**

### Improving health care

With the collaboration of the Cabildo de Tenerife, we intend to extend health care coverage in the **Yamoussoukro** region, especially for children in vulnerable situations. To this end, we have installed equipment to avoid electricity supply problems; training in gender equality and human rights; care of the environment and improvement of hygiene to promote sustainable development in the community.

### **Training and professional insertion**

With the collaboration of the Cabildo de Tenerife, the objective of this project is to improve the social and economic wellbeing of young people between 18 and 35 years of age who have no qualifications and are seeking employment. In addition to improving the infrastructure of the **Akatio training center**, **120 beneficiaries** will be trained in the promotion of human rights and the development of soft skills linked to employability and job placement.

## MOROCCO

### Football is life

In collaboration with **Enfants du Paradise**, this project promotes integration through sport. This entity works to achieve full social, school and work integration of **children with disabilities** in **Tangier**. With Bergner's help, this sports program complements the social and educational work of the Association, with **130 disabled children** participating three days a week in the sports facilities of Mghogha. In addition, some of these youngsters play matches with schools in the city, thus promoting diversity and inclusion.

#### **Inclusive Health**

This project is a way for **young people with disabilities (14-35 years old)** in **Tangier** to be included in the labor market, thanks to the collaboration of Cook & Chef Institute and Bergner Europe. During 2022, a space for training and qualification in the culinary field is created for these people within the Children of Paradise Association.



## OTHER AID


### **IVORY COAST**

- > Yamoussoukro. 4,600 for infant feeding (babies from 0-36 months) for HIV-positive mothers at the Walé Social Medical Center.
- > **Abidjan.** The Cabildo de Tenerife donated €60,000 for vocational training for 120 young people aged 18-35 with no qualifications or employment in Akatio.
- > N'Debó. From the international volunteer program of the El Prado Fomento School, we implemented a child nutrition program and promoted the first phase of construction of a church in the region. Budget: €7,042.78.

### **PHILIPPINES**

**Tondo.** The donation of €18,300 from individuals made it possible to extend Project Pearls' Hunger Relief program, which provides food for children, by one day a week.











# NATURE OF INCOME
