LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT Relying on youth

A NECESSARY PREMISE TO CHANGE THE WORLD

Once again, I am pleased to present this report, which includes some of the many activities carried out in the organization.

For some time we have been reflecting on the reasons why part of the European youth is going through a situation in which mental health problems are multiplying. Several studies point to a cocktail of ingredients: some toxic effects of social networks, uncertain economic perspectives, the alarmist tone of many media, the influence of a superficial youth culture, the dissolution of family life, etc.

Expressing discontent about youth, - because "it's bad" or one thinks that "they are not like they used to be" - is unfair and generates unproductive pessimism marked by mistrust.

This has been one of the issues that during 2023 we wanted to review in detail and we did it with our SERADE program, with the campaign "Youth is not bad". Because when young people are trusted, they reinforce many of the tools of their age. When optimism and joy permeate intergenerational dialogue, adults gain hope and young people gain the desire to take risks.

One of the main lines of our mission is to approach and confront the youth with social needs. First of all, those that are closest to them and that so often go unnoticed. The situation of the homeless, those who suffer the consequences of unwanted loneliness, those who suffer from an illness, those who have had to migrate because of war or exclusion, etc. This is the framework for a significant part of our social and volunteer programs. From the attention to families and soup kitchens, the Social Kitchen, the program Everyone To Breakfast, the programs of socio-educational attention, housing rehabilitation, etc.

And secondly, the needs of so many people, particularly in countries with a low level of development. This year, we held an exhibition on poverty and dignity that visited dozens of educational centers. And we have innovatively strengthened our collaboration with a number of educational institutions. Significant is the collaboration with the Colegio de Fomento El Prado, thanks to which we have built a school canteen and two churches in the Ivory Coast, as well as a child nutrition program in rural areas. Or our programs in India, Morocco and Senegal.

We renew our hope to continue and improve our collaboration and work at the European level through our International Youth Cooperation network with the exchange of experiences and activities among the young people of the ten countries where the organization is present.

Thanks to all of you who make possible the day to day of our association: companies, institutions and people who collaborate with enthusiasm and professionalism.

WHAT DO WE DO EDUCATIONAL SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY

We work for a comprehensive academic training since early stages of education, for young people not to remain indifferent to their environment's needs. In this task we include school, family, and society. In order to do so, we facilitate tools to help educational institutions transmitting a culture focused on the common good, in line with United Nations' Sustainable Development Goals.

We help schools to develop their Educational Social Responsibility plans. During 2023, this project has been supported by the Instituto de Juventud de la Junta de Castilla y León, the Diputación de Valladolid and the Xunta de Galicia.

What we offer:

- Advice for the design of an Educational Social Responsibility Plan (RSED Plan).
- Educational resources to improve knowledge of social needs, oriented to the Sustainable Development Goals.
- Training for teachers by providing tools that allow them to work with the educational materials that we provide to work on different social realities.
- Exhibitions, educational guides, audiovisuals, publications, web pages, resources for volunteering, forums and tools for social entrepreneurship, etc.
- We help in the implementation of the actions of the RSED Plan.
- Recognition as a Socially Responsible Center.
- Socio-educational support projects for minors in vulnerable situations.



FLYING TOGETHER

For more than 15 years, Cooperación Internacional and Boeing have shown their firm commitment to children in vulnerable situations through the socio-educational support program "Volando Juntos" (Flying Together) in Madrid. This project fosters **STEAM** skills and competencies in children in daily reinforcement classes, to bring science closer from the early years and eliminate the educational gap in this field of knowledge.





EDUCATIONAL MATERIALS

We edit and disseminate different educational materials such as training videos on social issues or traveling exhibitions, with awareness sessions, which are offered to all educational centers that request them.

Homeless people

In 2023, in collaboration with the residents of the **Santa María de la Paz homeless shelter**, a **didactic exhibition** on the reality of the street has been developed. The aim is to humanize these people, focusing on the fact that each of them has a previous history and many dreams to fulfill.

The exhibition includes an **educational guide** for teachers and educators to work on this issue with their students and thus promote greater awareness from schools.

Freedom in social networks

Addressing screen addiction and promoting healthy habits such as study, reading, sports, family life and volunteering are becoming a necessity to raise awareness among young people about the new media reality. From **Castilla y León**, we have trained **600 boys and girls** on this good use through an exhibition, didactic guide and audiovisual materials on the Internet and social networks.



LEISURE AND FREE TIME

Throughout the year, actions related to sports, respect for the environment and urban camps with socially disadvantaged children are promoted in Villa de Vallecas and Tetuán (**Madrid**), Zaragoza (**Aragón**), San Andrés (**Tenerife**) and Pontevedra (**Galicia**), in collaboration with some **60 youth associations**.

A FUTURE FOR CHILDREN

This program promotes educational reinforcement and improvement of academic performance with children in vulnerable situations. We provide tools to strengthen their personal and psycho-affective skills in workshops and cultural, sports, technological, artistic, leisure and free time activities.

In addition, families also participated in the "Parents' School", receiving training sessions on how to deal with the difficulties inherent to their children's educational work.

This educational reinforcement program is carried out in **Madrid**, **Andalucía**, **Castilla y León** and **Galicia**, with the support of public administrations and private entities.





I YOUTH

En este proyecto de sensibilización contra la discriminación y la xenofobia por una ciudadanía inclusiva han participado **4.502 jóvenes** en **Madrid**, **Pontevedra**, **A Coruña**, **Salamanca**, **Valladolid**, **Sevilla**, **Zaragoza** y **Tenerife**. Se han llevado a cabo aulas de sensibilización (**83 menores** de origen inmigrante), laboratorios de ideas (**341 jóvenes**), talleres interculturales (**356 jóvenes**) y foros (**180 jóvenes**) y múltiples acciones de sensibilización con más de **3.500 jóvenes** en entidades educativas.

En este marco, también se lanza la campaña **"Supongo"**, financiada por el Ministerio de Inclusión, Seguridad Social y Migraciones, para fomentar la reflexión entre los jóvenes sobre temas fundamentales como la xenofobia y los prejuicios sociales. Logró un alcance de **76.000 personas** en redes sociales y gracias a la colaboración con Metro de Madrid, superó los **20,4 millones de impactos**.



OBSERVATORY OF EDUCATIONAL SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY

This **Observatory** has more than ten years of experience in research, observation and analysis promoting the objective of transmitting to educational centers their responsibility in the achievement of the SDGs. It has an **International Academic Committee** formed by experts, professors and researchers from different universities in **Europe** and **Latin America**.

WHAT DO WE DO EDUCATIONAL SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY

SOCIAL LEADERSHIP PROGRAM

This program promotes the strengthening of the character of children and young people of immigrant origin and in a situation of social exclusion in the neighborhood of **San Pablo** (Zaragoza), an area with a high rate of marginalization. Some **50-60 volunteers**, high school and university students, participate in this project at **C.E.I.P. Santo Domingo** with **160 boys and girls**. From the 3 C's (head, body and heart, in Spanish "cabeza, cuerpo y corazón"), study, sports and volunteering are combined.

During the summer months, **PLS Summer** is in charge of continuing this reinforcement of knowledge, skills and values. With the support of **Bergner**, the **Nemesio Díez Foundation**, **Inycom**, **Evair**, **Caixabank** and the **Department** of **Social Welfare and Family of the Government of Aragon**, this program benefited **290 people** (160 people aged 9-22 and the 60 families, and 70 people from the social entities that participate each week) and some **2,000 indirect be-neficiaries** from the various awareness-raising actions during 2023.

There are five volunteer activities per week:

Desde 2019 se desarrolla el **Programa socioeducativo** en el barrio de **San Andrés (Tenerife)**. Se ofrece apoyo educativo y clases de inglés a **50 niños** en riesgo de exclusión social.

W. K. KELLOGG SCHOLARSHIP FOR STUDIES

This Kellogg's initiative, which belongs to the Kellanova company, is being developed in Spain in collaboration with Cooperación Internacional. These grants are aimed at beneficiaries of the "Everyone to Breakfast" program, which enables students with socioeconomic difficulties to continue their education. In 2023, five scholarships were awarded to secondary school students and students in competitive examinations. During the 2023-2024 academic year, 12 students will receive scholarships under this program.



EVERYONE TO BREAKFAST

Since 2011, **Kellanova**, formerly Kellogg Company, has been promoting this program to contribute to improving the conditions of children in vulnerable situations by offering them a balanced daily breakfast. Cooperación Internacional coordinates its development in Spain in collaboration with schools in **Madrid**, **Valencia**, **Valladolid**, **Málaga** and **Córdoba**. During the 2022-2023 school year,

141,177 breakfasts were served to 906 students.



WHAT DO WE DO VOLUNTEERING

Throughout the year, our volunteers participated in a wide variety of projects and initiatives for the benefit of the most disadvantaged sectors. Under the motto "Living for others", volunteering enables these young people to keep in mind the dimension of service to others in everything they undertake.



PROYECTO DE PARTICIPACIÓN VECINAL

During 2023, in **Tenerife**, in the neighborhood of Añaza, this project continues thanks to the support of VISOCAN. The objective is to improve the neighborhood coexistence of **350 families** in vulnerable situations through the renovation and painting of houses and common areas, children's workshops or community cleaning tasks.

VOLUNTEERING IN HOSPITALS

Through the **Hospilandia** program at the **Hospital Clínico Santiago de Compostela** and the **ASA-NOG Association** (Galicia), as well as at the **Hospital La Paz** (Madrid), volunteers accompany children who spend their day-to-day lives in a healthcare center. Also for the elderly, the **Hospital Clínico Universitario de Valladolid** tries to encourage reading among patients, providing books on loan and access to the virtual library of Castilla y León.

DNA PROGRAM

This project helps to meet the food needs of families at risk of social exclusion in Spain. In **Madrid**, **174 volunteers** serve **58 families** every month, thanks to the collaboration of the **Food Bank**. In **Seville**, during the year, food, clothing and school supplies were distributed to more than **250 underprivileged families**. In total, **90 volunteers** are involved in this program and reach **840 direct beneficiaries** and some **1,800 indirect beneficiaries**, in coordination with the Municipal Social Services of Torreblanca, Cerro-Su Eminencia, Sevilla Este-Alcosa-San Pablo and Nervión.



FRIDAY REVOLUTION

It is the best weekend solidarity plan. Hundreds of young people get to know the value of volunteering through specific actions to have the opportunity to discover the transforming value of stable social commitment. Every Friday and Saturday, dozens of **volunteers** deliver snacks and breakfasts to homeless people, rehabilitate houses through Painting For Others, visit the elderly, as well as organize sports and leisure activities with children and people with disabilities. During 2023, **276** young people participated in these solidarity activities in **Madrid**, **Seville**, **Málaga**, **Santiago de Compostela** and **Tenerife**.





BREAKFAST FOR OTHERS

School performance can be affected when children do not receive good nutrition. This action provides a complete and balanced breakfast, as well as accompaniment in the mornings, before the start of classes, to children in vulnerable situations. In **Valencia, 12 volunteers** distribute breakfasts every morning to **100 children** thanks to this program.







ENVIRONMENTAL VOLUNTEERING

In this area, with the aim of raising awareness of the importance of caring for the environment and preserving biodiversity, **30 volunteers** participated in the collection of garbage and cleaning of three beaches in **Santa Cruz** de **Tenerife**, among other actions related to respect for nature in different Spanish cities.

CORPORATIVE VOLUNTEERING

We assist companies in the development of social action plans and volunteering that involve employees in projects in favor of the SDGs. This line of work allows us to respond to specific social needs through partnerships with other organizations, companies and their employees. Throughout 2023, more than **450 volunteers** from organizations such as **Fundación Mutua Madrileña**, **Fundación Telefónica**, **Enagás**, **Redevco**, **Edenred** and **Sacyr**, among others, were involved. Thanks to their collaboration, we were able to develop solidarity initiatives to help Ukrainian refugee families; improve the quality of life of people in situations of exclusion; offer healthy and responsible leisure to vulnerable groups; care for the environment; accompany the elderly in nursing homes; participate in soup kitchens; care for the homeless, etc.

We have also counted on the involvement of employees of companies that financially support Cooperación Internacional projects and with whom we look for ways to take advantage of the talent and solidarity of their human capital.

For example, **Boeing** also involves members of its team to give **STEAM workshops** to children from "Flying Together". They also organize visits to museums, theme parks and other fun activities. **Ayvens**, one of our main logistical partners, participates in **Solidarity Breakfasts**, **Painting for Others** and **A Smile For Christmas**. **BBVA Asset Management**, a partner of the **Vistalegre Social Kitchen**, involved its employees in the cooking shifts.





Volunteering fairs

During 2023, Cooperación Internacional was present at various volunteer fairs, bringing solidarity activities closer to young people: UPM Volunfair (15th February) IEB Solidarity Forum (19th April) IE University Volunteering Fair (3rd October) Valladolid University Fair (5th October) UCM Volunteering Day (29th November)

HOMELESS PEOPLE

Solidarity breakfasts and snacks are organized in all Territorial Areas to provide accompaniment to the homeless. Throughout 2023, thanks to the support of **Kellanova**, more than **300 volunteers** distributed breakfasts and provided support and accompaniment to homeless people in **A Coruña**, **Córdoba**, **Gijón**, **Madrid**, **Málaga**, **Oviedo**, **Santander**, **Santiago de Compostela**, **Seville**, **Valladolid** and **Vigo**. In Madrid alone, the average number of people assisted **each weekend** is **160 beneficiaries**.



VISTALEGRE SOCIAL KITCHEN

After the beginnings of this project in March 2021, we continue to help cover the basic food needs of hundreds of disadvantaged people in **Madrid**. During 2023, with the support of **Palacio Vistalegre** and the **Instituto Tecnológico Fuenllana** and, in collaboration with the **Comedor Social de Torrejón de Ardoz**, **460 weekly menus** were prepared. In total, more than **70 volunteers** were involved this year, cooking **22,880 menus** for underprivileged people. This year, **Logista Parcel**, **Ayvens**, **Mercadona**, **KFC**, **Academica Spain**, **Fundación Pryconsa**, **Pictet Group Foundation**, **Fundación Inocente**, **Lazard**, **Bankinter** and **Banco Sabadell** participated as collaborators.



SOUP KITCHENS

In Madrid, around **150 volunteers** from youth groups cook for homeless and vulnerable families in the soup kitchens of **San José** (San Ramón Nonato Parish) and **Canillejas** (Virgen Blanca Parish).

In addition, Cooperación Internacional has collaborated with the **Cooking For Others** project to distribute meals to **250 families** at risk of social exclusion in **Madrid**.





BUSINESS SOLIDARITY DAY

In its **16th edition**, this corporate volunteer day organized by **Cooperación Internacional** brought together **18 social entities** and **22 companies** that participated in **14 initiatives** aimed at improving social and environmental conditions in their immediate surroundings.

In 2023, **400 volunteers** participated in **A Coruña**, **Barcelona**, **Badajoz**, **Gijón**, **Madrid**, **Sevilla**, **Tenerife**, **Valencia** and **Zaragoza**.

SPAINSIGHT

In collaboration with the **Netwomening Association**, more than **70 volunteers** have given Spanish classes to **65 Afghan refugee women** who fled the Taliban and are currently living in Spain.

WHAT DO WE DO VOLUNTEERING

PAINTING FOR OTHERS

For 27 years, this project has made it possible for families at risk of exclusion to have a more dignified and welcoming home. In **Madrid**, **480 volunteers** rehabilitated **22 homes**; in **A Coruña**, another **five homes** were rehabilitated with the help of **63 volunteers**; in **Valladolid**, **six homes** were painted and **one more** in **León**, thanks to the collaboration of **30 volunteers**. Another **49 volunteers** painted **five houses** in **Sevilla** and **Málaga**. In 2023, **Tenerife**, **Barcelona**, **Santander** and **Valencia** also joined this project, with the collaboration of the **Social Services** of the different cities and the financial and logistical support of **Fundación Pryconsa** and **Ayvens**, and the donation of materials by **Wenceslao García** and **Garlanda**, with the donation of paint for the project.

A SMILE FOR CHRISTMAS

This campaign has **2,000 volunteers** who are involved in the **350 solidarity initiatives** organized throughout **Spain** to distribute gifts to children in vulnerable situations. This is possible thanks to the participation of thousands of company employees who collaborate by buying a new gift for these children. In 2023, **9,080 children** at risk of social exclusion were able to enjoy their gifts this Christmas, involving **8,480 employees** from **79 companies** in **34 Spanish cities**. This project has the special collaboration of **Bankinter** and **BNP Paribas**, the outstanding participation of **Fundación Telefónica** and the logistical support of **Ayvens**. In addition, among the many social actions of the campaign, food was distributed to **2,157 direct beneficiaries**, in collaboration with **86 social entities**.











SOLIDARITY EVENTS

- Once again, Valladolid welcomed **90** players to its Entrepinos Charity Golf Tournament to benefit the NGO's social projects.
- The XI Intercompany Charity 7-a-side Football Tournament in Madrid brought together eight teams from five companies. The funds raised will go to the Un Futuro para la Infancia (A Future for Children) project.

INTERNATIONAL VOLUNTEER PROGRAM

Dozens of young volunteers from Madrid, Andalucía, Valencia, Castilla y León, Aragón and Galicia took an active part in social transformation in different parts of the world.

From the **Levante Territorial Area**, the volunteers traveled to **Gambia** to improve the conditions and facilities of two schools in **Banjul**: the Saint Anthony Nursery School (Kololi) and the Santa Teresa School Center.

In **Galicia**, another group of young people traveled to **Tangier** in July to help in an orphanage with the Sisters of La Creche and in the White Cross Center, as well as giving Spanish classes to local workers.

As in previous years, we have also been in **Ivory Coast**, **Guatemala**, **Portugal**, **India** and **Senegal**.





"BE MORE YOU" CAMPAIGN

"Be more you" is the claim of this campaign aimed at raising awareness among young people about the importance of volunteering. This initiative is part of the **Living For Others** program and is supported by the Ministry of Social Rights and 2030 Agenda.

The campaign's main objective is to foster a culture of solidarity among young people and motivate them to actively participate in solidarity activities as a way to be more authentic with themselves and contribute to the welfare of society. The spot has been very well received on social networks and platforms.



WHAT DO WE DO SOCIAL INNOVATION

International Cooperation works from this area to develop the skills and capacities of young people seeking their active participation in social transformation.



· Automation

In 2015, we created International **Youth Cooperation (IYC)**. This network promotes a culture of responsibility and solidarity among young Europeans through social action programs for children and youth, training programs and volunteer exchanges in **12 countries**.











SCALE UP

This program seeks to develop young people's talent, measure it and certify it, in order to improve their skills and employability. In 2023, we organized the **Scale Up Course: development of competencies in volunteering for university students**, directed by **Javier Milán**, with the aim of getting to know themselves better and developing competencies in the personal, academic and work spheres. **Eight online seminars** were held between September and November, with a total of **20 hours of training**, for **90 young people** from the Rey Juan Carlos University, the Valladolid University, the Valencia University and the Monterrey University.

In **Galicia**, training workshops were organized in **9 youth organizations**, educational centers and senior high schools. In addition, another course was given at the University of A Coruña to train young people in competencies. In the **Levante** area, **140 young people** participated and two courses on employability were given to **200 young people** from **Palencia**, **Burgos**, **León**, **Salamanca** and **Valladolid**.

CONFERENCES AND MEETINGS

Every year, Cooperación Internacional takes part in the organization of innovation and training conferences and meetings. In 2023, thanks to the **Culture and Assistance Foundation**, we collaborated in the **Pyrenees University Days (PUD**). Every summer, this event brings together more than **200 students** from **25 Spanish** and international universities. Seminars, conferences and colloquiums explore topics such as "The virtual age", "Humanities in the times of Artificial Intelligence" or "A brave new world?".

We also collaborate with this Foundation in the **XXXI Humanistic Conferences** with interdisciplinary working groups (Philosophy, Music, Film, Communication, History, Literature, Art and Theater). In **Seville**, at the **Guadaira College**, on the occasion of the **UNIV 2023 Forum** "Searching for happiness", cultural and academic activities were organized with **48 university students**.

In addition, **Cooperación Internacional** organized the **MIF Debate Tournament**, a meeting of young people held every year in Fatima. In 2023, the theme was "Minors and the use of technology: Should the government impose restrictions to avoid problems such as addiction or dependence?









VOTERS "VOLUNTEERS FROM SCHOOL"

Along with three schools in **Gerona**, **Athens** and **Palermo**, plus two NGOs (Greece and Italy) and a Greek company, Cooperación Internacional has collaborated to train teachers and heads of studies to introduce social awareness and volunteering in schools. In addition, didactic guides on different social issues have been produced to give them tools with workshops, sessions and activities to strengthen the social commitment of students.



SERADE PROGRAM: YOUTH IS NOT BAD

This Program is framed within the European Union Strategy for Youth (European Goals 2019-2027) and is supported by the **Ministry of Social Rights and 2030 Agenda**.

#YouthIsNotBad is a campaign that seeks to raise awareness about trust in young people. The message it aims to convey to young people is that they should become the architects of their own lives and provide them with the necessary resources to be active citizens, agents of solidarity and positive change.



WOMEN AND SOCIAL INNOVATION

We understand the role that women play as agents of change, therefore, from Cooperación Internacional we work to broaden their personal and professional horizons, promoting their social participation and aspiring to achieve greater inclusion and equality.



1) SECOND CHANCE

This project aims to give a second chance to **women and girls** who are sexually exploited in Mumbai. Through sewing courses and training in values, it seeks to provide them with job training and basic skills to improve their autonomy and independence and to get a job.

2) SPANISH CLASSES FOR MIGRANT WOMEN

Since 2020, Spanish classes have been given to Moroccan women in the neighborhoods of Palmete (Seville). This training is given by **3 volunteers** to **8 women**, on Tuesday and Thursday mornings, reaching **52 indirect beneficiaries**.

WHAT DO WE DO SOCIAL INNOVATION



This program is aimed at encouraging social entrepreneurship among young people through idea labs and mentoring activities. In 2023, sessions were held in **Madrid**, **Santiago de Compostela**, **Sevilla**, **Valencia**, **Valladolid** and **Zaragoza**. Specifically, in Madrid and Seville, with the support of **Fundación Telefónica** and **Fundación Cajasol**, the sessions were divided into two phases: a first phase in which the young people explained how they decided to start their respective businesses in the social field; and a second phase that opened a working space for groups to develop a real innovation case and defend it before a jury in order to qualify for a seed capital of **1,000 euros**.

This project was funded by the Ministry of Social Rights and 2030 Agenda.





WHAT DO WE DO DEVELOPING

Development Cooperation has been one of the lines of work since the beginning of Cooperación Internacional. Our projects are carried out in collaboration with local entities and are focused on improving the quality of life, the fight against poverty and inequality of the most disadvantaged communities.





EDUCATION

The purpose of this project is to improve the conditions of two schools in Banjul. At St. Anthony's Nursery School, we collaborated in the construction of the kitchen and playground and the organization of a summer camp with recreational activities and Spanish classes for children. At St. Therese Primary School, six classrooms were refurbished and painted, with a complete electrical installation and lighting system for the start of the new school year.



In addition, thanks to the donation of equipment, а computer room with an audiovisual projector and Internet connection was set up.



IMPROVING HEALTH CARE

MUMBA

In recent years, health coverage in the Yamoussoukro region has been expanded, especially for children in vulnerable situations. To this end, we have installed equipment to improve the electricity supply and we work with the community through training in different areas such as hygiene, gender equality, human rights, as well as care for the environment.



TRAINING AND PROFESSIONAL INSERTION

This project promotes the social and economic wellbeing of one of the most disadvantaged sectors, which includes young people between the ages of 18 and 35 who are unskilled and seeking employment. In addition to improving the infrastructure of the Akatio training center, 120 beneficiaries were trained in human rights and the development of soft skills linked to employability and job placement.



FOOTBALL IS LIFE

This project is developed in collaboration with **Enfants du Paradis**, an organization that promotes the integration of **children with disabilities** in **Tangier**. With Bergner's help, this sports program complements this social and educational work with **100 children with disabilities** who participate three days a week at the **Mghogha** facilities. In turn, these young people are also involved in **social volunteering** activities in Tangier.



INCLUSIVE HEALTH

This project promotes the labor inclusion of **young people with disabilities (14-35 years old)** in **Tangier**. During 2023, **Enfants du Paradis** continues with the training and qualification in the culinary field of these people in vulnerable situations, and about **155 people** are assisted with the socio-sports program.



WATER FOR ALL

200,000 people live in the **Baiganwadi** slum (Mumbai), 78% of whom live in extreme poverty, without even access to clean water. This program installs drinking water connections and filters, in collaboration with **Bergner** and **Lok Seva Sangaam**, a local association with which we have been collaborating since 2012 in educational programs for the benefit of these families.



YOUTH LEADERSHIP PROGRAM

In 2023, this educational program benefited **85 children and adolescents in the process of social inclusion** living in extremely poor environments in the slum of **Baiganwadi** (Mumbai). In addition, it encourages the participation of young people in social projects at the local and international level.

SECOND CHANCE

Since 2021 and until 2023, **144 women (14-45 years old)** have been given a "second chance" thanks to this project that trains them in the art of sewing, provides them with basic literacy classes and personalized tutoring as sustainable ways to combat sexual exploitation and the semi-slavery regime in which they live. In collaboration with the local NGO **Grace Harvest Ministry**, they work on the rehabilitation and integral development of women and girls in **Kamathipura**, in the "red light" area (Mumbai).

For the second consecutive year, the **Cabildo de Tenerife** collaborates with **30,000 euros** for the implementation of the project "Improvement of the process of care, monitoring and nutritional support to newborn children of HIV+ mothers".

From the International Volunteer Program of the **Colegio de Fomento El Prado**, we implemented a child nutrition program for **750 Ivorian children**, a school canteen and two churches were built in **Kpangbassou** and **Bezro** and two multipurpose spaces in **Attiegouakro**.

The solidarity campaign **A** Smile for Christmas distributed hundreds of gifts to children from Hogar Nazaret (Peru), CEPS (Cameroon) and the Iwoka Foundation (Colombia).




We present the economic report with the financial statements for the year 2023. The annual accounts of Cooperación Internacional are audited by DBF AUDIFOR, S.L.


