## LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT

# Me nace (‘From Within’), the attraction of choosing what is worth it.

Choosing is not a fiction. We run the risk of choosing badly, or simply not as well as we could. But when we get it right and choose what is worthwhile, we understand better the value of freedom. That’s the main reason for volunteering. Because #menace (‘it comes from within’).

With this simple slogan, we have promoted and channeled volunteering this year among thousands of young people through numerous initiatives: homeless people, hospitals and residences, socio-educational support, soup kitchens, etc. It was a year marked by the DANA storm, which severely affected the Valencian Community on October 29.

The heavy rains and floods that devastated the region caused massive material damage, put our infrastructures to the test and, most painfully, directly affected thousands of people with the tragic death of 227 individuals...

The magnitude of that meteorological event not only left its mark on our territory, but also directly challenged our collective ability to respond. And in that context of urgency and shock, the youth of our country offered an exemplary response.

While many were still trying to comprehend the magnitude of the disaster, young people were already on the streets. Organized by neighborhoods, associations, social media, they jumped into action: bailing water out of flooded houses, bringing food and blankets to elderly people trapped in their homes, collaborating with emergency teams, offering emotional support to those affected...

This is just one example - this year, the most representative - of the great strength of so many people committed to improving what is around them. We have seen it too in those involved daily with the Vistalegre Social Kitchen, the Social Leadership Program, socio-educational support in Galicia, Madrid, Castile and León, Andalusia and the Canary Islands; the housing rehabilitation program, support for homeless people; and so many others.

Thanks to them and to all the people, educational institutions, associations, companies, and organizations who trust in our work and support our mission to create pathways for social action among young.

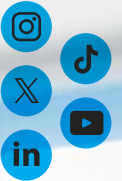

**Cooperación Internacional** is a Spanish non-profit organization, **State Award for Social Volunteering 2017, Gold Cross of the Civil Order of Social Solidarity** and officially recognized as a Public Utility Entity. Since 1993, it has been working 'for a youth committed to solidarity'.

Outside of Spain, the organization operates under the name **International Youth Cooperation**.

According to the Christian view of humanity, Cooperación Internacional promotes a culture of solidarity among young people and offers them the opportunity to engage in volunteering, education and awareness projects as tools for social transformation. We support human development in accordance with the dignity of people.

To achieve this, we create pathways for social participation through **FOUR LINES OF ACTION**:

## Educational Social Responsibility

We seek ways to involve the school, the family and society as a whole in raising awareness of their enormous potential to promote a culture of social justice.

## Development

In line with the SDGs, we understand development as the expansion of human rights and real individual freedoms.

## Social Innovation

We develop young people's skills and abilities so they can become key players in social transformation.

## Volunteering

We create channels for the social participation of young people through volunteering and other solidarity actions in favor of those most in need.





# where we work

Cooperación Internacional carries out most of its work in Spain. In recent years, we have created a global brand -International Youth Cooperation- which in 2024 reached 12 countries: Portugal, Spain, the Netherlands, Croatia, Hungary, Czech Republic, Slovakia, Estonia, Latvia, Italy, Finland and Sweden. # Educational social responsibility

From the early stages of education, we work for a comprehensive education so that young people do not remain indifferent to the needs of their environment. In this task, we engage the school, the family and society in general. To this end, we provide tools that help educational institutions promote a culture focused on the common good, based on human dignity and human rights.

## Volando juntos ('Flying Together')

**Cooperación Internacional** and Boeing show their firm commitment to children in vulnerable situations in Madrid. After 15 years, Volando Juntos is a socio-educational support program that brings science closer to schoolchildren. In 2024, as part of the **STEAM** education received by the participants, the program incorporated **theater** classes, where students, through a variety of activities, strengthened their self-esteem and learned about improvisation, teamwork and problem solving.

## Leisure and free time

Throughout the year, we promote activities related to sports and environmental awareness in collaboration with around **60 youth associations**. In addition to urban camps in **Madrid, Aragon, the Canary Islands and Galicia**.

In **A Coruña**, a project was launched to reconnect young people with the environment, through art and environmental education, with the Portuguese artist **Clo Bourgard**.



## Solidarity School

We help schools to develop their **Educational Social Responsibility plans**. During 2024, this project has been supported by the **Youth Institute of the Regional Government of Castile and León (Instituto de Juventud de la Junta de Castilla y León)**, the **Valladolid Provincial Council (Diputación de Valladolid)** and the **Galician Regional Government (Xunta de Galicia)**.

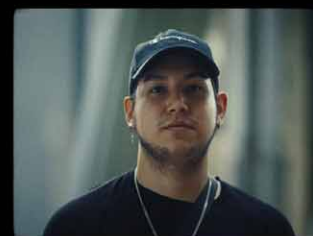

## I YOUTH

The **I Youth** project, funded by the **Spanish Ministry of Inclusion, Social Security and Migration**, and co-financed by the **European Social Fund**, aims to combat racism, discrimination and xenophobia in schools, universities and youth associations in Spain. To this end, it seeks to create spaces for coexistence and empathy among young people from different cultural backgrounds and origins.

As part of this project, **35 sessions** were held in **26 educational centers**, raising awareness among **9,186 young people**. We also organised idea laboratories with **210 young people**, and **10 intercultural workshops** involving **473 young people** in **6 Spanish cities**, among other activities. In addition, we launched the campaign *Rompe la Cadena* ('Break the Chain') which has more than **428,000 views**, along with a poster campaign in the **Madrid Metro**. The campaign video was later broadcast on **RTVE (TVE 1 and TVE 2)** and other regional channels such as **RTVA (Canal Sur)**.

# ROMPE LA CADENA



## Social Leadership Program (PLS)

This program promotes the strengthening of the character of children and young people living in socially disadvantaged situations in the neighborhood of **San Pablo (Zaragoza)**, an area with a large immigrant population and high unemployment. **60 volunteers, high school and university students**, participate in this project in collaboration with CEIP Santo Domingo with **150 children between the ages of 9 and 22 years old**.

With the support of **Bergner**, the **Nemesio Díez Foundation**, **Inycom by Nunsys Group**, the **Department of Social Welfare and Family of the Government of Aragon**, **Evair**, **Caixabank** and **Pellsa**, this program reaches some 2,000 indirect beneficiaries. During 2024, it has directly benefited **260 people**, including participants, families and social entities.

In **Tenerife**, in the **San Andrés** neighborhood, PLS support **60 students** from **CEIP and IES San Andrés** from 3rd grade of primary school to 4th year of Secondary School, thanks to funding from **CaixaBank** and the **'La Caixa' Foundation**. In 2024, thanks to the support of the **Nemesio Díez Foundation**, PLS is expanding to **Seville** and **Valencia**, in addition to starting its activity in the city of **Ibagué (Colombia)**.



## Observatory of Educational Social Responsibility

This **Observatory** has more than ten years of experience in research, observation and analysis promoting the objective of transmitting to educational centers their responsibility in achieving the SDGs. It has an **International Academic Committee** made up of experts, professors and researchers from different universities across **Europe** and **Latin America**.

## Un Futuro para la Infancia ('A Future for Children')

This program promotes academic support and improved school performance for children in vulnerable situations. We provide tools to strengthen their personal and psycho-affective skills through workshops and cultural, sports, technological, artistic, leisure and free time activities, among others.

This educational reinforcement program is carried out in **Madrid, Andalusia, Canary Islands, Castile and Leon, Galicia** (more than 270 minors and about 240 volunteers), with support from public administrations and private entities. In addition, in 2024, a **School for Families** was organized in **Madrid** and other educational programs such as **Mais Familia**, in **Galicia**, with **641 adults and 60 minors** who were trained in the principle of shared responsibility in education.



## Educational materials

We develop different materials that are offered to schools during the academic year.



## ESCÚCHAME! (LISTEN TO ME!)

From the **Territorial Area of Andalusia**, in **Malaga**, four new awareness videos have been released based on the **Escúchame!** exhibition, offering an in-depth look at the lives of people living with hearing loss and how they cope with it. This project is carried out in collaboration with **T-Oigo** and with the support of **OLFER** and **Meanwell**.

## ZERO HUNGER

**"Connecting Dots 2030: ODS2"** is a project financed by the Community of Madrid that promotes the development of a committed citizenship based on the SDGs. As part of this initiative, thematic exhibitions about world hunger have been organized, along with 10 educational sessions held in schools to raise students' awareness of this global issue.



## PEOPLE WITH DISABILITIES

This video shows the reality of people with disabilities, highlighting how each one of them is unique and irreplaceable. It emphasizes the need to raise awareness of the physical, cognitive, and attitudinal barriers they faced. This initiative is funded by the Community of Madrid.

## Kellogg's Scholarships

This Kellogg's initiative is developed in Spain in collaboration with Cooperación Internacional, aimed at the beneficiaries of the **Todos a Desayunar ('Breakfast Club')** program, which enables students with socio-economic difficulties to continue their education. During the 2024 academic year, five scholarships were awarded for Secondary School, Vocational Training and University Degrees. During the 2023-2024 academic year, **15 students** are receiving scholarships through this program.

## Todos a Desayunar

Since 2011, **Kellanova** has been promoting this program to improve the living conditions of children in vulnerable situations by providing them with a daily and balanced breakfast. Cooperación Internacional coordinates the program in Spain in collaboration with schools in **Madrid, Valencia, Valladolid, Malaga** and **Cordoba**.

During the 2023-2024 school year, 140,923 breakfasts were served to **905 students**.

## Freedom Online

This project, launched in **Castille and León**, involved **850 young people** from **10 educational centers** in 2024. It aims to train students in the correct and responsible use of screens and social media. Workshops are also held for families, providing tools and recommendations for good management of these platforms.





# WHAT WE DO Volunteering

Under the motto “Living for others”, volunteering encourages to embrace a spirit of service in everything they do. Our volunteers are involved in multiple activities and projects for the benefit of the most disadvantaged sectors.

# HAZTE VOLUNTARIO

## DANA

The torrential rains caused by the **DANA storm** have resulted in great losses, leaving many families with nothing and facing the enormous challenge of rebuilding their lives and recovering normality. The **Levante Area**, in particular, has been actively involved in preparing spaces, coordinating rehabilitation tasks, cleaning and painting, collecting cleaning and hygiene products, as well as channeling financial donations from companies such as **Grupo Mtech, Cognizant, Astellas Pharma** and **Fundación Inocente**.





## Friday Revolution

**There is no better weekend plan.** Hundreds of young people discover the value of volunteering through specific actions and become engaged in more long-term social commitments. Every Friday and Saturday, dozens of volunteers deliver snacks and breakfasts to homeless people, rehabilitate houses through Painting For Others, visit disadvantaged families or senior centers, organize sports and leisure activities for children and people with disabilities.

This year, **574 young people** took part in these solidarity activities in **Madrid, Seville, Malaga, Almeria, Santiago de Compostela, A Coruña, Pontevedra, Tenerife, Gran Canaria, La Gomera** and **Palma de Mallorca**.



## Breakfast for others

Thanks to this project, around **100 vulnerable** children in **Valencia** receive a complete and balanced breakfast, along with support before the start of morning classes.

## Neighborhood participation project

This project in the neighborhood of **Añaza (Tenerife)**, with the support of **VISOCAN**, promotes the improvement of neighborhood coexistence of **359 vulnerable** families through social actions, such as house painting, renovation of common areas, community cleaning tasks, children's workshops, and more.





## Homeless people

Every year, more than **300 volunteers** distribute breakfasts and offer accompaniment to homeless people in **A Coruña, Badajoz, Madrid, Málaga, Oviedo, Santander, Santiago de Compostela, Seville, Valencia** and **Valladolid**.



## ADN Program

The **Ayuda Directa a las Necesidades** program ('Direct Assistance to Needs') helps cover the food needs of vulnerable families in Spain, thanks to the collaboration of the **Food Bank**. In **Madrid**, **58 families** are served each month. In **Seville**, more than **65 volunteers** distribute **90 tons of food** per year, along with approximately **3 tons** of personal hygiene and cleaning products to around **180 families** and about **600 direct beneficiaries**.

## Soup Kitchens

Our volunteers participate in soup kitchens to support homeless people and families in vulnerable situations. In **Madrid**, **155 young people** regularly collaborate with the **soup kitchens of San José** (San Ramón Nonato Parish) and **Canillejas** (Virgen Blanca Parish).



## Vistalegre Social Kitchen

During 2024, more than **30 permanent volunteers** and **60 occasional volunteers** helped prepare **480 menus each week** for the beneficiaries of the **Solidarity Canteen of Torrejón de Ardoz**. The Project is supported by the **Vistalegre Arena, Fuenllana Technological Institute**, and **Logista Parcel**, with the collaboration of **Académica, Fundación Pryconsa, Ayvens, Premios ABC Solidario** and **Fundación Moeve** and with the donation in kind of **Mercadona** and **KFC**.



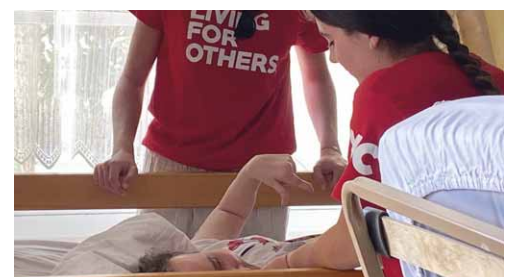
## Environmental volunteering

Caring for the environment and preserving biodiversity is everyone's responsibility. Throughout the year, cleaning, recycling and environmental awareness actions are carried out in different Spanish cities in Asturias, the Canary Islands and Madrid.



## Volunteering in hospitals

In the *Hospilandia* program at the **Hospital Clínico de Santiago**, together with the **ASA-NOG Association**, as well as at the **Hospital La Paz (Madrid)**, volunteers accompany hospitalized children who spend their daily lives in a health center. Also for the elderly, we promote **Lecturas pacientes** at the **Hospital Clínico Universitario of Valladolid**, which encourages reading among these people, providing loaned books and access to the virtual library of Castile and León.







## Painting for others

This project promotes housing rehabilitation and makes it possible for families at risk of exclusion to have a more dignified and welcoming home. **Madrid, Castile and León, Canary Islands, Galicia, Catalonia, Cantabria, Comunidad Valenciana and Andalusia** are part of this project, which is driven by Social Services and supported financially and materially by organizations such as **Fundación 'La Caixa', Fundación Pryconsa, Fundación Inocente, Ayvens, Up Spain, Wenceslao García** or **Garlanda**.

In 2024, more than **400 volunteers** painted **21 homes** and **3 social spaces** in Madrid, as well as sheltered apartments managed by the **Generalitat** for people with mental illness. They also worked on several community spaces and a **Shelter House** for minors with psychiatric disorders in A Coruña, in addition to rehabilitating homes in **Paiporta, Algemesí, Catarroja** and **Picanya**, towns affected by the DANA storm, in Valencia.



## Una Sonrisa por Navidad (A Smile for Christmas)

This **solidarity campaign** reached **8,727 vulnerable children** last Christmas, thanks to the commitment and generosity of **76 companies**, the special collaboration of **Bankinter, BNP Paribas**, the outstanding participation of **Fundación Telefónica** and the logistical support of **Ayvens**.





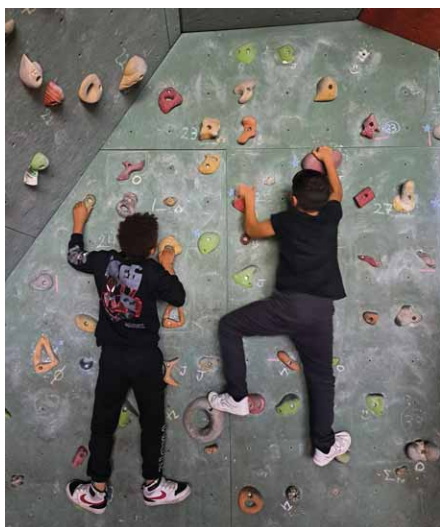
## International volunteering

Every year, the **International Volunteer Program** gives hundreds of young people the opportunity to get involved in social projects in different countries.

- Dozens of young people from **Madrid** (60), **Zaragoza** (45), **Salamanca** (12) and **Valladolid** (40) were involved in the **Inclusive Health Project (Tangier)**.
- A group of university students from **Zaragoza** participated in projects in **India (Mumbai)**.
- **29 young people** from **Granada** got involved in improving educational conditions at Timboni Primary School in Kilifi (Kenia)
- From **Madrid**, **65 students** from **Montealto School** are involved in social initiatives in **Guatemala**; **El Prado School** continued its Social Action Program in **Yamoussoukro (Ivory Coast)**; and another 16 volunteers participated in various social projects in **Lisbon (Portugal)**.
- **20 university students from Valencia** took part in the reconstruction and repair of **Kololi School (Gambia)**, benefiting 500 children.
- For the first time, 6 groups of volunteers traveled to **Lourdes (France)** to rehabilitate the **Benedictine abbey of Saint-Pé-de-Bigorre**, a historic site in the Hautes-Pyrénées.







## Corporate volunteering

We collaborate with companies to develop corporate volunteering plans that encourage team participation in solidarity initiatives, seeking to generate a positive impact on society. This line of work allows us to respond to specific social needs and support vulnerable groups through partnerships between organizations. In 2024, **510 volunteers** from companies such as **Fundación Mutua Madrileña, Fundación Telefónica, Coca-Cola, Inycom by Nunsys Group** or **Ipsen Pharma**, among others, were involved.

Corporate volunteering also allows employees to participate in the social projects their companies support financially. It connects the company's purpose with the social concerns of its team and channels the talent and spirit of service of its human capital.

In this regard, **Boeing** involves team members to teach **STEAM workshops** in the Volando Juntos (Flying Together) socio-educational support program. Bergner employees contribute to the **Programa de Liderazgo Social** (Social Leadership Project) in favor of the most vulnerable children in **Zaragoza, Tangier** and **Bombay**. **Ayvens**, one of our main logistics partners, participates in initiatives such as Desayunos Solidarios (Solidarity Breakfasts,) Painting For Others and Una Sonrisa por Navidad (A smile for Christmas).



This year, in addition, **Artistas en el camino de la vida (Artists on the road of life)** took place, a day of reflection and awareness on corporate volunteering with the **Ibercaja** team. The event aimed to foster awareness, training and personal growth among its employees, build bridges to other social realities and strengthen community commitment. It marked the beginning of Ibercaja's corporate volunteering program with us, positioning the company as a key social agent in helping the most vulnerable.

## Día Solidario de las Empresas ('Companies Solidarity Day')

In its **XVII** edition, **19 companies** and **15 social entities** meet in this day marked by solidarity and social commitment. **240 company volunteers**, organized in 26 teams, carried out **19 activities** focused on social and environmental improvement across **6 Spanish cities**.

- The **XII Intercompany 7-a-side Football Charity Tournament (Madrid)** supports Un Futuro para la Infancia (A Future for Children).
- The **XII Entrepinos Solidarity Golf Tournament (Valladolid)** donates the funds raised to families in vulnerable situations.
- The **Intercompany Charity Paddle Tournament** channels its proceeds to **PLS (Mumbai, Tangier and Zaragoza)**.



# Social Innovation

WHAT WE DO

Through this line of work, we promote the skills and abilities of young people, aiming for their direct participation in social transformation.

We focus on developing transversal competencies: promoting reading habits, public speaking skills through the MIF Fatima program; work skills through the Optimal Work for Youth program; and the ability of young people to foster true friendship relationships.

## Digital communities



In **Tenerife**, **American Tower** presents a pioneering initiative aimed at creating a digital community in **Añaza** and its surrounding areas. The project seeks to empower people with limited resources by providing them with tools and knowledge to improve their digital skills.



## Scale Up

This program aims to develop young people talent to improve their skills and employability. A certification of the competencies developed through volunteering can be obtained via the platform [scaleupyouth.eu](https://scaleupyouth.eu).

Once again, the **Scale Up Course: Skills Development in Volunteering for University Students**, led by **Javier Milán**, trained 90 students in self-awareness and the strengthening of personal, academic and work skills. Young people from the universities **Rey Juan Carlos, Seville, Pablo Olavide, Politécnica de Madrid, Villanueva** and **CES Don Bosco** participated in these 8 online seminars (20 hours).

In **Valencia**, **6 training sessions** were organized and, in **Galicia**, workshops were held in **8 youth organizations, educational centers and student residences**, as well as meetings with companies focused on the value of volunteering.

In **Valladolid**, workshops were also held at the **Colegio Mayor San Juan Evangelista, the University of Valladolid** and the **CEIP José Zorrilla**.

International Youth Cooperation (IYC) promotes a culture of responsibility and solidarity among young Europeans in **12 countries**, through training programs and social action initiatives in favor of children and youth, as well as volunteer exchange programs.





## Workshops and meetings

As every year, we participate in the organization of multiple innovation and training meetings, such as the **XXXII Jornadas Humanísticas** with interdisciplinary working groups and the **Jornadas Universitarias de los Pirineos (JUP)**, with the **Fundación Cultura y Asistencia**. Since 1983, JUP have brought together more than **200 students** each year for different seminars and conferences centered around a specific theme, this year the theme was **'The Human Factor'**.

At the **UNIV 2024 Forum**, we participated with young people from **Seville** and **Granada**, focusing on understanding work as a place for personal growth and fulfillment. In **Fatima (Portugal)**, Cooperación Internacional organized the **MIF Debate Tournament**, where **17 teams** reflected on friendship, social media and digital environments.

## Women and social innovation

Women are important agents of change. At Cooperación Internacional we work to broaden their personal and professional horizons, encouraging their participation and aspiring to achieve greater inclusion and equality in society.



### 1) SECOND CHANCE

Through sewing courses and training in values, we train **women and girls** who are victims of sexual exploitation in **Mumbai (India)**, helping them gain autonomy and access employment.



### 2) SPANISH CLASSES

In the **Territorial Area of Andalusia**, volunteers are involved in literacy tasks for 12 Moroccan women in the neighborhood of **Palmete (Seville)**.



### 3) HEALTH CARE

This project aims to expand and strengthen healthcare efforts, especially for women, by enhancing the health programs of the **Walé Social Medical Center (Yamoussoukro)**, in **Ivory Coast**.



### 4) SKILLS TRAINING AND EDUCATION

In **Guatemala**, we developed different training and education projects for women in the municipalities of **Mazatenango**, **Cuyotenango** and **Quetzaltenango**, in collaboration with **FUNDAP**.



### 5) WOMEN IN AFGHANISTAN

In collaboration with **Netwomening**, we organized sessions in schools and institutions on the Human Rights of Girls and Women in **Afghanistan**, based on the testimony of **Muzhda Hotak**, an Afghan woman who lived under the Taliban regime and is now safe in Spain.







## VoterS “Volunteers from school”

Through different European institutions (**Spain, Greece and Italy**), VoterS trains teachers and academic coordinators to introduce a sense of European social responsibility in schools and to promote volunteering. With funding from the **European Union**, this project trains thoughtful and responsible citizens through learning and community service. In June, the **Multiplier Event Madrid** was held during an interdisciplinary session of the project, bringing together **25 people** at the **Colegio Santo Angel** in **Madrid**.

# WHAT WE DO Development

Development Cooperation has been one of the core areas of work at Cooperación Internacional since its inception. Our projects are carried out in collaboration with local organizations and aim to improve quality of life, fight poverty and reduce inequality in the most disadvantaged communities.



## Morocco

### > Inclusive Health Project

#### Sociocultural sports school

In partnership with **Enfants du Paradis**, this project promotes the social inclusion of children with disabilities through sports in **Tangier**. Thanks to **Bergner's support**, **127 children with disabilities** participate three days a week in **Mghogha's** sports facilities, complementing their education at the association. Matches with other local schools are also organized to raise awareness among youth and promote real inclusion in the community.

#### Social Kitchen

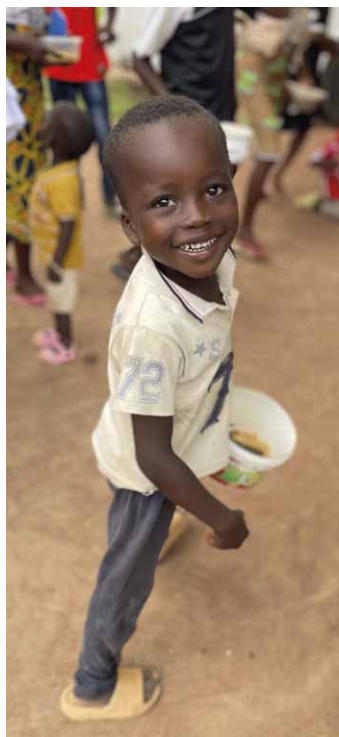
In collaboration with **Enfants du Paradis**, this project promotes training and job inclusion for young people with disabilities. Thanks to the support of **Bergner** and **Inycom by Nunsys Group**, an adapted culinary classroom has been created where practical and theoretical classes are taught, as well as social and management skills sessions. This space provides them with professional training and promotes their personal and social development. A total of **29 young people with disabilities** participate in this program, receiving 33 hours of training per week, and **3 of them** have already found employment in the local hospitality sector.

## Ivory Coast

### > Improving health care

Over the last few years, the health coverage of the **Yamoussoukro** region has been expanded, especially for children in vulnerable situations. Equipment has been installed to improve the electricity supply and direct work is being done with the community through training in basic hygiene, gender equality, human rights, as well as environmental care and sustainable development.

### > Training and professional integration

This project supports the social and economic well-being of one of the most disadvantaged sectors, which includes young people between 18 and 35 years of age with no qualifications and who are seeking for employment. In addition to improving the infrastructure of the **Akatio training center**, **120 beneficiaries** received training in human rights and the development of soft skills related to employability and job placement.

## India

### > Youth Leadership Program

This educational project promotes the social inclusion of around **100 children and adolescents** living in conditions of extreme poverty in the slum of **Baiganwadi (Mumbai)**. In addition, it encourages the participation of young people in social projects at both local and international level. This project is supported by **Bergner Europe** and **Bergner India**.



### > Water for all

With the support of **Bergner Europe** and **Bergner India**, this project, developed in partnership with the local **NGO Lok Seva Sangam**, aims to connect families in the slum of **Baiganwadi** to the water supply network and to install a filter to make the water safe for consumption.

### > Second Chance

This project offers a 'second chance' to women and girls living in conditions of sexual slavery in **Kamathipura (Mumbai)**. With the support of **Bergner Europe** and **Bergner India**, it seeks to empower them through basic literacy and leadership strengthening, in collaboration with the local **NGO Grace Harvest Ministry** which has rescued more than **400 women** in these conditions.

## Gambia

### > Education

The Gambia School Project is an initiative that promotes the construction of an elementary school: a building with 6 classrooms, 4 bathrooms, 2 teachers' offices, 1 septic tank, 1 well and the provision of the necessary furniture for the classrooms (chairs and desks) with the shipment of a container. In Banjul, about 1,000 children live with their families and about 100 children attend private schools in the community. The others go to other primary schools in Kanifing and other places located more than 5 kilometers away.



## Guatemala

### > Vocational training

In collaboration with **FUNDAP** and with the support of the **Xunta de Galicia**, this project aims to improve employment opportunities and prevent the migration of young people and women from vulnerable rural communities in Guatemala, specifically in the municipalities of **Mazatenango** and **Cuyotenango**, in the department of **Suchitepéquez**.

## Other assistance

- In 2024, the **Colegio de Fomento El Prado** carried out a child nutrition program for **750 children**, along with the construction of two churches and a school canteen in the outskirts of Yamoussoukro. In addition, Spanish classes were given to **150 children**.
- Thanks to the *Una Sonrisa Por Navidad* campaign, 600 gifts were distributed to **hundreds of children in the Côte d'Ivoire** and to the **Iwoka Foundation (Colombia)**.



# transparency and accountability

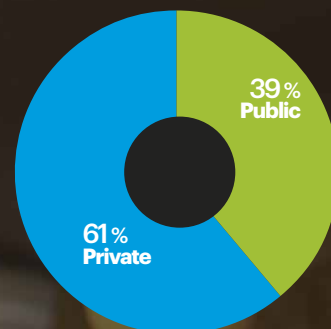

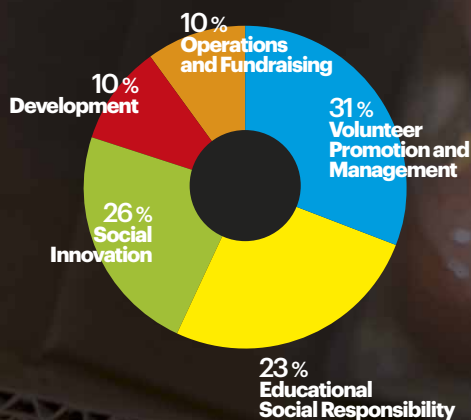

## Source of income



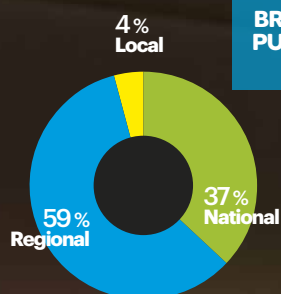
## Application of resources



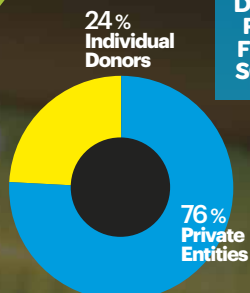

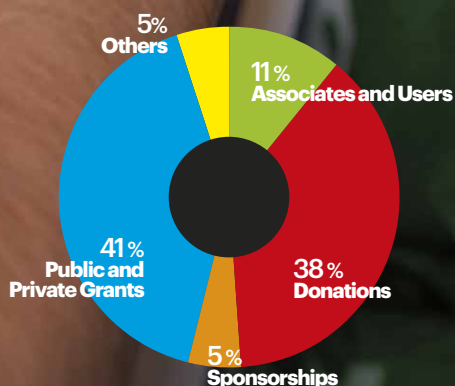


#### BREAKDOWN OF PUBLIC FUNDING SOURCES
