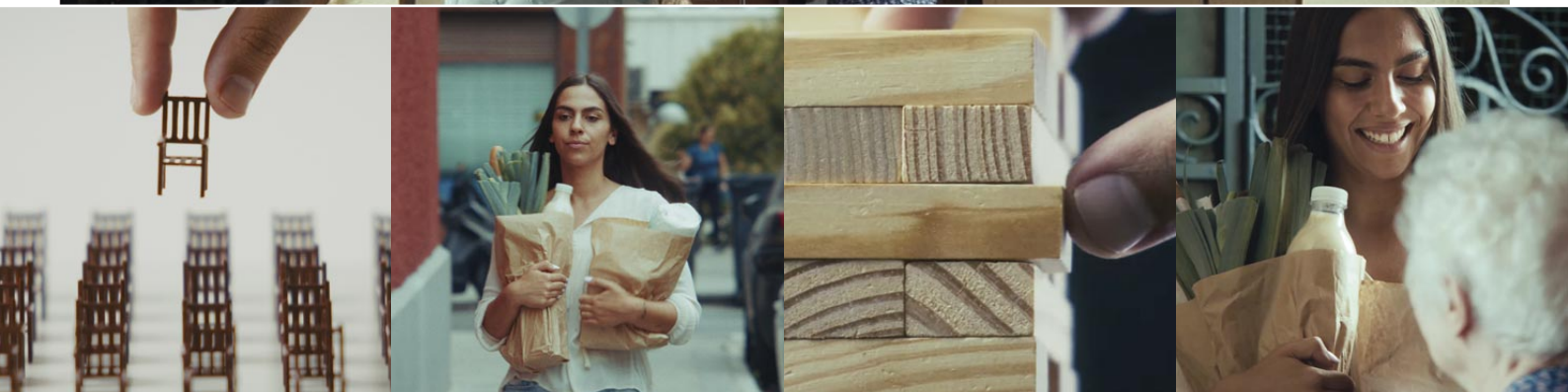

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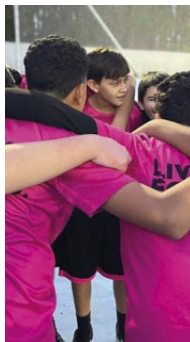

It is the recipient of the **2017 National Social Volunteering Award, the Gold Cross of the Civil Order of Social Solidarity**, and has been officially recognised as a Public Benefit Organisation. The NGO is also active internationally through its **International Youth Cooperation** brand, which supports its work beyond Spain.

Guided by a Christian understanding of the human person, Cooperación Internacional promotes a culture of solidarity among young people and provides opportunities for them to engage in volunteering, education and awareness-raising initiatives as instruments for social transformation. We foster human development in a manner consistent with the dignity and worth of every individual.

To achieve this, we create opportunities for social participation through **FOUR KEY AREAS OF ACTION:**

We seek ways to engage schools, families and society as a whole in raising awareness of their tremendous potential to promote a culture of social justice.

What we do

EDUCATIONAL SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY

From the earliest stages of education, we work to provide a holistic education that encourages young people not to remain indifferent to the needs of those around them. In this effort, we engage schools, families and society as a whole. To support this goal, we provide educational institutions with tools and resources that help foster a culture centred on the common good, grounded in human dignity and human rights.



VOLANDO JUNTOS ('FLYING TOGETHER')

Cooperación Internacional and **Boeing** have been running **Flying Together** since 2007, a socio-educational support program aimed at fostering the holistic development of vulnerable children and young people in Madrid's Tetuán district through academic support, learning workshops, and personal development activities. The project incorporates the **STE-AM** methodology to help bridge the educational gap by combining scientific and technological skills with creative thinking and artistic expression. Through this approach, participants learn to solve challenges and apply these disciplines to their daily lives and future career paths.

SOLIDARITY SCHOOL

We support educational centres in developing their **Educational Social Responsibility plans**. In 2025, this project has been supported by the Youth Institute of the **Regional Government of Castile and León** (Instituto de Juventud de la Junta de Castilla y León), the **Valladolid Provincial Council** (Diputación de Valladolid) and the **Galician Regional Government** (Xunta de Galicia).



What we offer

- Advice for the design and implementation of an Educational Social Responsibility Plan.
- Educational resources to improve knowledge of social needs.
- Teacher training to support the use of educational materials.
- Exhibitions, teaching guides, publications, websites, volunteer resources, forums and tools for social entrepreneurship, etc.
- Recognition as a Socially Responsible Center.
- Socio-educational support projects for children in vulnerable situations.



OBSERVATORY OF EDUCATIONAL SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY

With more than 10 years of experience, the **Observatory** promotes the objective of raising awareness among educational centres of their responsibility in contributing to the achievement of the SDGs. It has an **International Academic Committee** composed of experts, professors and researchers from various universities across **Europe** and **Latin America**.



UN FUTURO PARA LA INFANCIA ('A FUTURE FOR CHILDREN')

This programme promotes educational support and the strengthening of personal, psychological and emotional skills in children in situations of vulnerability. In 2025, we have developed multiple initiatives and workshops in **Madrid**, **Andalusia**, **Castile and León**, the **Canary Islands** and **Galicia**, with the support of public administrations and private entities.

LEISURE AND FREE TIME

Throughout the year, activities are promoted related to sports practice and respect for the environment, involving around **60 youth associations**. These also include urban camps held in **Madrid**, **Aragon**, the **Canary Islands** and **Galicia**.

EDUCATIONAL MATERIALS

As part of “Vulnerables: A Project to Raise Awareness and Promote Social Cohesion,” funded by the Community of Madrid’s 0.7% income tax grant program, the following materials were developed:

1) Video about Taibah, an Afghan refugee

The stories of refugees are marked by violence, persecution or conflict in their countries of origin.

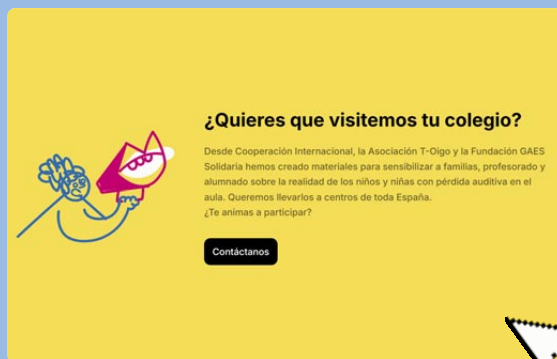
Taibah is a young Afghan woman who had to leave everything behind in her country and move to Spain, starting a new life from scratch.



2) Work and Social Security Contributions in Spain

Netwomening is a non-profit association that supports Afghan women under international protection in Spain to restart their lives by building a network of support. This **informational material** has been designed to provide Afghan women with basic information on how to work and contribute to the social security system in Spain.

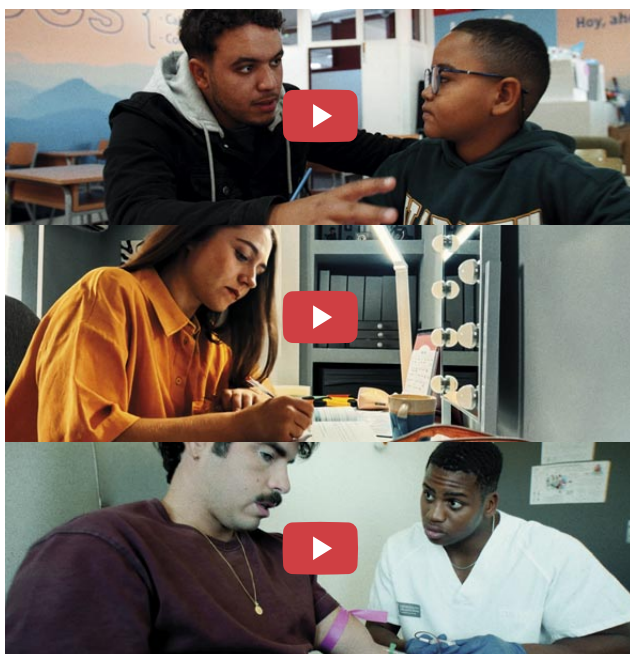

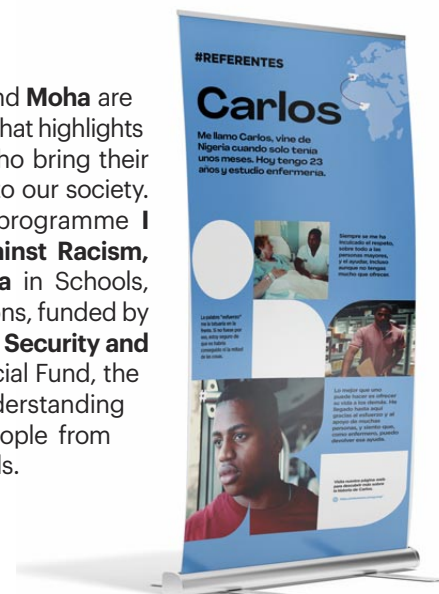

REFERENTES ('ROLE MODELS') CAMPAIGN

The stories of **Bianca**, **Carlos**, and **Moha** are part of **#Referentes**, a campaign that highlights the contributions of migrants who bring their talent, values and commitment to our society. Within the framework of the programme **I Youth: Awareness-Raising Against Racism, Discrimination and Xenophobia** in Schools, Universities and Youth Associations, funded by the **Ministry of Inclusion, Social Security and Migration** and the European Social Fund, the campaign video promotes understanding and empathy among young people from diverse cultures and backgrounds.

SOCIAL LEADERSHIP PROGRAM (PLS)

Motivation for study, sport and life. This is what students participating in the **PLS** programme find: motivation for study, sport and life, opening up new horizons through comprehensive 360° education. This programme promotes the strengthening of the character of children and young people in situations of social disadvantage in the **San Pablo district (Zaragoza)**, an area with a high migrant population and high unemployment rates. Around **60 student volunteers** take part, supporting approximately **150 children** and young people (aged 9–22), in collaboration with **CEIP Santo Domingo**. In 2025, the programme directly benefited 260 people.

Across its different areas of action, it reaches approximately **2,000 indirect beneficiaries** per year, thanks also to the support of **Bergner, Fundación Nemesio Díez, Ibercaja, the Department of Social Welfare and Family of the Government of Aragon, Evair, CaixaBank** and **Pellsa**.

The PLS has been implemented for years in **Zaragoza** and has also expanded to the cities of **Seville, Málaga, Valencia** and **Tenerife**, as well as extending its reach to the training of international leaders in the city of **Ibagué, Colombia**.



KELLOGG'S SCHOLARSHIPS

Kellogg's and **Cooperación Internacional** implement this initiative in Spain, aimed at beneficiaries of the **"Todos a Desayunar"** programme, enabling them to continue their studies despite socio-economic challenges. In 2025, **two scholarships** were awarded to pursue upper secondary education (Bachillerato studies). For the 2025–2026 academic year, there are **12 scholarship recipients**.



TODOS A DESAYUNAR

Kellogg's has been promoting this programme for 15 years to help improve the conditions of children in vulnerable situations, providing them with a daily balanced breakfast. During the 2024–2025 academic year, **123,244 breakfasts** were served to **864 students** in schools across **Madrid, Valencia, Valladolid, Málaga** and **Córdoba**.

FREEDOM ONLINE

More than **800 schoolchildren** benefit from this project, promoted in **Castile and León**, which aims to encourage the responsible use of screens and social media.



What we do

VOLUNTARIADO

Volunteering enables young people to keep in mind the dimension of service to others in everything they undertake. Our volunteers take part in a wide range of activities and projects aimed at supporting the most disadvantaged groups.



TRAINING

We train volunteers so that they can carry out their work properly and effectively, while also acquiring skills and knowledge that enable them to become agents of change and social innovators.

The volunteer training programme includes:

- > Basic training for volunteers
- > Specialized training
- > Ongoing training
- > Training for coordinators

ENVIRONMENTAL VOLUNTEERING



The protection of the natural environment and biodiversity is also part of citizens' social responsibility. Throughout the year, and in different cities, we organise cleaning, recycling and environmental education activities to promote care for the environment.



VOLUNTEERING IN HOSPITALS

In collaboration with healthcare staff, we carry out accompaniment activities for children in the **Paediatric Classroom of the Hospital Clínico de Santiago (Galicia)**, thanks to the involvement of 43 university student volunteers. In Castile and León, we have promoted "**Lecturas Pacientes**" ("Patient Reading"), reaching **85 adult inpatients** at the **Hospital Clínico de Valladolid**, encouraging reading through loaned books and access to a virtual library. In **Madrid**, 60 volunteers from **Hospital La Paz** visit "La Pajarera" on a weekly basis to spend time with children admitted to the hospital and their families.

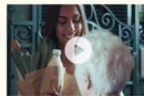

Queremos despertar su sensibilidad social y que se conviertan en agentes de cambio de su grupo o comunidad.



Buscamos que se acerquen a la realidad de colectivos en situación de vulnerabilidad y exclusión social y se sientan impulsados a colaborar en la mejora de su situación. Trabajamos con personas mayores, menores en situación vulnerable, personas sin hogar, personas con discapacidad, población reclusa, personas hospitalizadas...

NEW

Volunteer Coordinators' Guide

This year we have launched this new Guide aimed at people who coordinate volunteering activities, in order to help them feel more capable of carrying out their role in the best possible way, and to ensure they feel supported and confident in their position as coordinators.



DANA

Following the severe damage caused by the **DANA** storm, Cooperación Internacional has been strongly present in the most affected areas. From the **Levante Regional Office** in particular, more than **100 volunteers** have been mobilised, contributing to the rehabilitation of spaces, cleaning tasks, and the distribution of food and basic supplies, as well as accompanying people living in loneliness who have lost everything. This year, thanks to the commitment of **Cognizant**, **Astellas Pharma**, the **Inocente Foundation**, and the **"la Caixa" Foundation**, **17 homes** have been refurbished.



HOMELESS PEOPLE

Thanks to the commitment of more than **300 volunteers**, we are able to support this group at risk of social exclusion through companionship and direct assistance. Breakfasts and afternoon snacks are distributed and, most importantly, volunteers share their time with them through meaningful moments of conversation and the exchange of experiences.



NEIGHBORHOOD PARTICIPATION PROJECT

This project seeks to provide comprehensive intervention in the **Añaza** neighbourhood (**Tenerife**) and focuses on socio-educational support for children, the improvement of community coexistence, and the rehabilitation of homes and shared spaces. In 2025, **121 volunteers** took part, benefiting **357 people** in situations of vulnerability.



ADN PROGRAM

In partnership with the **Food Bank**, the **Direct Assistance for Basic Needs (ADN)** programme helps meet the nutritional needs of people in situations of vulnerability. During the year, the programme was implemented in several cities: **Seville: 200 beneficiary families** supported by **14 volunteers**. **Algeciras: 15 beneficiary families** supported by **10 volunteers**. **Madrid: an average of 30 families** supported, with the involvement of **334 volunteers**. **Extremadura: 8 volunteers** visit **6 disadvantaged families** each month, providing ongoing support and assistance.



BREAKFAST FOR OTHERS

This project provides a complete and balanced breakfast, as well as support and companionship before the start of the school day, to **100 children** in situations of vulnerability in **Valencia**.

FRIDAY REVOLUTION

Every Friday—and on weekends as well—dozens of volunteers help distribute snacks and breakfast to homeless people, renovate homes through Painting For Others, visit disadvantaged families or senior centers, and organize sports and leisure activities for children and people with disabilities. Every year, around 600 young students participate in solidarity initiatives in various cities across Spain.

SOUP KITCHENS

Throughout the year, we collaborate with community kitchens to support people experiencing homelessness and families in situations of vulnerability. In **Madrid, 210 young volunteers** participate in the community **kitchens of San José** (Parish of San Ramón Nonato) and **Cañillejas** (Parish of Virgen Blanca).



VISTALEGRE SOCIAL KITCHEN

During 2025, **60 volunteers** served **28,880 meals** to disadvantaged people in **Madrid**. The project is supported by **Palacio Vistalegre** and the **Fuenllana Institute of Technology**, and provides **560 meals** each week to the Torrejón de Ardoz Community Kitchen and the Teena María Community Kitchen, run by the NGO Mundo Justo. This is made possible thanks to the support of **Logista Parcel**, which manages distribution, together with **Ayvens** and **Glovo**. This year, the project also received financial support from **Académica**, **Fundación Pryconsa**, **Banco Sabadell** and **Nartex**, as well as in-kind donations from **Mercadona** and **KFC**.

In 2025, Banco Sabadell recognised the project for its social impact and commitment to solidarity.



INTERNATIONAL VOLUNTEERING

Each year, between June and July, Cooperación Internacional organises its **International Volunteering Programme**, offering hundreds of young people the opportunity to engage in social projects in different countries.



In **Morocco (Tangier)**, 120 volunteers collaborated in orphanages, centres for people with disabilities, and programmes supporting children in street situations.



In **Côte d'Ivoire**, 105 young people participated in the construction of community infrastructure across different regions.



In **India (Mumbai)**, volunteers took part in a Leadership Camp alongside young people undergoing social inclusion processes in the Baiganwadi slum.



In **Tanzania** and **The Gambia**, participants combined social action with sustainable development through initiatives focused on education, reforestation and reconstruction.



In **France (Lourdes)**, volunteers contributed to the restoration of an abbey, combining physical effort with personal reflection.





UNA SONRISA POR NAVIDAD (A SMILE FOR CHRISTMAS)

Once again, this Christmas solidarity campaign exceeded expectations. In its 32nd edition, **A Smile for Christmas** reached **8,655 children** in vulnerable situations, thanks to the commitment and generosity of employees and partner companies. Once again, we were fortunate to count on the invaluable support of BNP Paribas as Special Partner, Fundación Telefónica for its Outstanding Participation, and Ayvens as Logistics Partner.

PAINTING FOR OTHERS



This project engages hundreds of young people each year, who dedicate their free time to painting and refurbishing the homes of people in situations of vulnerability. In 2025, more than **25 homes** were renovated across different Autonomous Communities of Spain, including **Andalusia**, the **Canary Islands**, **Cantabria**, **Castile and León**, **Catalonia**, the **Valencian Community**, **Galicia** and **Madrid**. The project is carried out in collaboration with local Social Services departments and receives financial support and materials from **Fundación Pryconsa**, **Ayvens**, **Wenceslao García** and **Garlanda**.



CORPORATE VOLUNTEERING

We collaborate with the business community to design and implement corporate volunteering programmes that channel the talent and commitment to service of their employees. These strategic partnerships encourage participation in solidarity initiatives that address specific social needs and support people in situations of vulnerability.

In 2025, more than **650 volunteers** from **15 companies** took part in these initiatives. Among them was **Fundación Mutua Madrileña**, which supports volunteering activities throughout the year; **Reale Seguros**, with whom we launched a dedicated Volunteering Week; and **Enagás**, which promotes volunteering initiatives across its different business divisions.

Corporate volunteering also enables employees to become actively involved in the social projects that their companies support financially. **Boeing** engages its employees in delivering STEAM workshops as part of the Flying Together programme. **Bergner** and **Ibercaja**, in addition to supporting the Social Leadership Programme, involve their teams in volunteering activities with children and young people facing social disadvantage, people with disabilities, and older adults.



DÍA SOLIDARIO DE LAS EMPRESAS ('COMPANIES SOLIDARITY DAY')

Cooperación Internacional organised the **18th Corporate Solidarity Day**, with **12 companies**, **200 employee volunteers** and **15 social organisations**. This corporate volunteering event brought together a range of solidarity activities focused on social and environmental improvement, as well as sports practice, across **Madrid, Badajoz, Barcelona, Seville, Valencia** and **Zaragoza**.



SOLIDARITY EVENTS

- The **II Intercompany Charity Pádel Tournament (Zaragoza)**, co-organized with **Pádel Indoor Cuarte**, drew more than **100 players**. The funds raised will go toward social projects in the city, **India**, and **Morocco**.
- The **XIII Charity Golf Tournament (Valladolid)** supports the Una Sonrisa por Navidad (A Smile for Christmas) campaign, benefiting **380 children** in vulnerable situation.
- The **I Charity Padel Tournament (Málaga)** promotes support for children at risk of social exclusion in the city.
- The **XIII Intercompany Charity 7-a-side Football Tournament (Madrid)** featured 9 companies and 12 teams supporting Un Futuro para la Infancia (A Future for Children).

What is the point of everything being perfectly organised if someone is left without help? This campaign focuses on what is essentially human: freedom, the ability to choose, to care, to accompany others, to show compassion... and ultimately, to love. With the support of the **Ministry of Social Rights, Consumer Affairs and the 2030 Agenda**, this video encourages young people not to wait for a “perfect solution” before taking action, but to adopt a proactive attitude, because we are already ready. “All It Takes Is... Getting Started!” This campaign has also counted on the collaboration of RTVE, with free broadcast on **TVE1** and **La 2**, as well as the support of **Metro de Madrid**, with **500 posters** displayed throughout the public transport network in the Community of Madrid.

The **MIF** is held annually and gathers more than **1,500 European young people (aged 14–16)**, who take part in a wide range of cultural and sports activities in the Portuguese city during Holy Week.

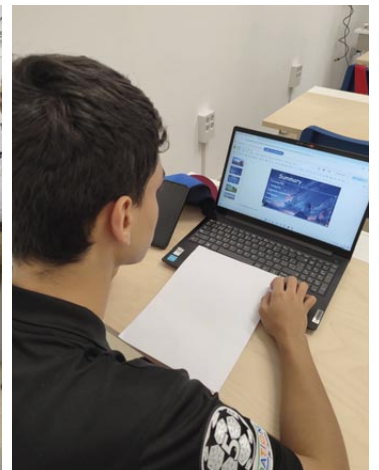

The partnership with **American Tower** enables work on reducing the digital divide in vulnerable settings in **Tenerife**. The project aims to empower families and older people with limited resources in the use of technology, reducing their administrative and social isolation. In 2025, the digital skills of 300 disadvantaged people on the island were improved.





**WOMEN AND
SOCIAL INNOVATION**



Women are an important agent of change. At Cooperación Internacional, we work to broaden their personal and professional horizons, fostering their participation and striving to achieve greater inclusion and equality in society.



1) Second Chance

Since 2021, this programme has promoted greater autonomy and employability among women and girls who are victims of sexual exploitation in **Mumbai (India)**. In 2025, **60 women** attended the training centre to learn tailoring skills. They also receive basic literacy classes and personalised tutoring.

2) Spanish Classes

Spanish classes are delivered for migrant women through the **Andalusia Regional Office**. The volunteers who coordinate this activity provide literacy support to Moroccan women in the Palmete neighbourhood (**Seville**).



3) Market with local products

In July, a market was built in the town of Mahounou Nananfouè (**Yamoussoukro, Côte d'Ivoire**), at the request of the local women's association, to support the sale of local products and the child nutrition programme for **600 children**.

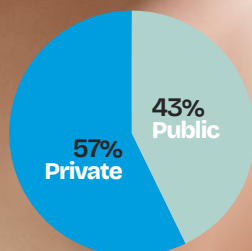

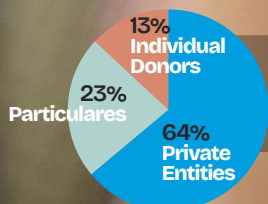
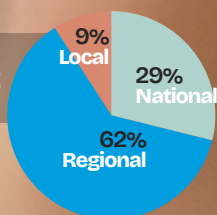

SOURCE OF INCOME

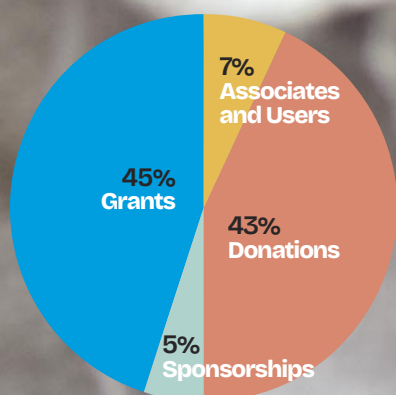


Breakdown of public funding sources
